PONTOON BRIDGE **ACROSS MEUSE FOR** SEIGE ARTILLERY

Amsterdam, August 13.-The second attempt of the German army to build a pontoon bridge at Heerstal over the Meuse was successful, according to a despatch Maastricht today. The bridge is intended for passage of seige artillery, several of which are being sent to Liege and others to Namur.
