A few weeks before the dec-1 laration of war the German naval annual called "Nauticus" appeared. This volume declares itself to be published on authority, and it is regarded as an admiralty publication. The volume for this year is larger than usual, and contains a complete record of the naval progress of all other navies in the world but that of Germany. The Berlin correspondent of the British Navy League gives an interesting review of the first section of this book. This section is a "political review" of naval history from a highly German standpoint.

The feature of this discussion which struck the Berlin correspondent most forcibly was the contempt of "Nauticus" for Britain and her power. The volume describes all the propositions made by Britain for limiting naval armaments and for a naval holiday. It declares them all to be hypocritical. The teaching all through is that Britain is exhausted, that her resources are strained to the utmost, that social reforms call for all the money in the treasury, and that pov-

erty, not philanthrophy, is behind all these peace suggestions. It is made to appear that Germany has never been deceived by these indications of distress. The reader of "Nauticus," is assured, according to the British reviewer, that "German resources in money, men and skill are increasing as rapidly as the corresponding British resources are declining." The supply of German fighting men is inexhaustible; its financial position is equal to any emergency; its trade is growing enormously; its foreign policy has been crowned with brilliant success. "And as an offset to this record of splendid achievement the catalogue of British failure is related with immense relish and a regard for detail which extend even to our inferior naval guns."

So reports the reviewer for "The Navy." If his synopsis is a fair one we begin to understand how the German people have gained the conviction they were authorized to dominate Europe and the world .-News-Advertiser.
