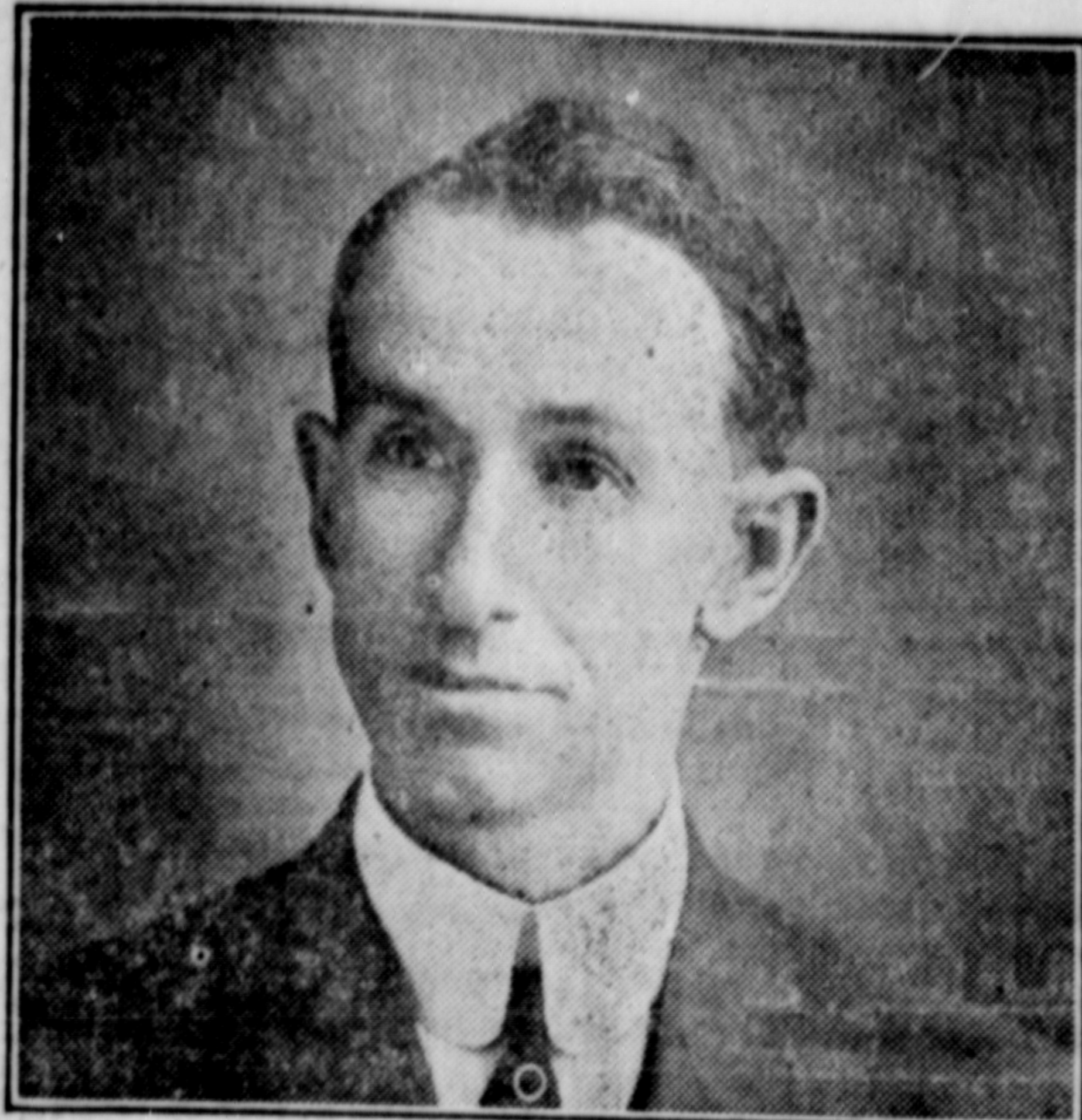

## GERMAN LOSSES WERE HEAVY AT TERMONDE

Terrible Havoc Done by Bombardment of That Belgian Town.

London, Sept. 14.—The correspondent of The Chronicle at Ghent says that terrible havoc has been done at Termonde by the German bombardment.

Telegraphing from Ostend, a correspondent of Reuter's says the German casualties in the fighting around Ghent were estimated at 5,000 men. A number of German soldiers were drowned when the dykes around Termonde were cut, and several German guns were lost in the flood. Continuing, the correspondent says the Germans advanced Sunday in a northerly direction from Brussels, between Ghent and Antwerp.

All telegraphic and railroad communication between these towns is interrupted. Several hotels in Ostend have been closed for fear of the arrival of the German invaders.

An engagement occurred at Cordegem, south of Ghent. Belgian cyclists and gendarmes had a sharp engagement with the enemy which resulted in the Belgians retiring before a superior force. A Belgian major was killed.

The correspondent of The Express, wiring from Termonde, 16 miles from Ghent, said: "Termonde has fallen after six hours of fighting. The little force of 6,000 Belgians made a gallant defence, but the enemy was 20,000 strong and the Belgians were unable to reply effectively to the deadly fire of the German siege guns."

"The Germans began the attack between 2 and 3 o'clock in the morning and the rain of shells over the town was incessant until 9 o'clock. It was a hopeless task, attempting to hold earthworks against such odds, and one by one the slender defences were abandoned. The defenders were able to leave in good order without serious losses and went by way of Bersler and Overmeire in the direction of Ghent. "After entering the town, the Germans set it afire and through-

out the morning dense clouds of smoke overhung the town. Not three miles away the peasants, with strange and dull apathy, were still working in their gardens, sometimes turning to watch the smoke. Only the children seemed afraid and they ran and hid from the motor cars.

"I sighted German outposts from Termonde within three miles of Ghent and there are indications that they will almost immediately occupy Ghent. The people are greatly excited and many are preparing for flight."

The British official bureau repeats its statement that Britain has not laid any mines in the North Sea and cannot be charged with the injury caused by the present mine-laying.
