Four hundred and eighty-two of Vancouver's foreign population have applied to become naturalized British subjects since August 1, doubtless on account of the war. Thirty-seven Germans and 19 Austrians wish to desert their home land. More than 200 applications came from Japanese who wish to qualify to serve in Canadian regiments to be sent to England. Judge Brant before whom the applications come, has asked the Minister of Justice what he will do with this great prospective inrush of citizenship.
