SCHOONER COLLIDED WITH JAP IDZUMA AND WAS SUNK

Portland, Ore., Sept. 19.—A message sent by wireless from an unknown vessel off the Columbia River Marconi station said that the schooner Francis H. Leggett had been sunk 60 miles south of the Columbia River. The Seattle Japanese consul said he had been notified through the wireless station that the vessel had been sunk off the Columbia. Through the same agency he heard rumors that the sinking of the vessel came through a collision with the Japanese cruiser Idzuma and he was endeavoring to get into communication with the Idzuma. At a late hour he was unable to reach the cruiser by wireless. Her whereabouts is unknown.
