CANADIAN BANKS SAID TO VIOLATE THEIR PRIVILEGES

(Regina Daily Province.)

All the assistance which the government of Canada is endeavoring to give to the people through the medium of the banks is being held up by the banks for their own additional security. The banks are inviting reprisals thereby, which, unless we mistake the temper of the Canadian people, will not be long delayed.

In several articles recently this paper has congratulated the people of Canada upon possessing a government strong enough, in the present crisis, to take such emergency measures as would ensure a continuance of commercial and general credits. The govits power. It has taken such steps as should ensure to Canada an enviable position as regards stability of trade and in-

In only one thing was the government mistaken. It considered the Canadian banks a trustworthy medium through which to extend assistance to a country sorely stricken by the financial panie which, the world over, followed the alarm of war.

That medium has failed, thus far, at least. It may yet rehabilitate itself in the eyes of the people and the government. It must be prompt, or it will invite reprisals. The occasion, in fact, will demand them.

Ordinary commercial credits have been cut off. Every business in Canada is suffering. Farmers suffer-the security of the wheat, which is better than gold, is no longer taken. Municipal governments suffer. Canada is as badly off, in fact, as if she were without banking facilities. The assistance the government has extended has not reached the peoplehas not passed beyond the control of the banks. Credit is practically non-existent ,and without credit the business fabric cannot hold together.

PREDICTED END OF GERMAN RULE

London, Sept. 25 .- General Nogi's prediction, made at the siege of Port Arthur, is still fresh in the minds of Englishmen. General Nogi said:

"I believe the world will witness a great war which will have all Europe for its battleground. and will settle the Franco-Prussian question and the Anglo-German rivalry.

"France and Germany will meet in this last decisive conflict on the Belgian plains, probably near Waterloo, the only spot which will permit of the evolution of the great armies which will face each other. At the present time the French and German frontiers are too strongly fortified for either people to force its way through. I have little doubt as to the result of this war. France will beat Germany on land and Britain will crush Germany at

"This will be the last great war in Europe for many years, perhaps for ever. The German states will emerge from this war so exhausted and so terrified that they will have no other object; than to form some sort of condition that they may in the future obviate the recurrence of any such catastrophe."

Prayers have been offered in some churches specifically asking that the prediction of the Japanese strategist be realized.
