DREADFUL CALAMITY; KAISER AND ADMIRAL PLAN BRITAIN'S FALL

Rome, Oct. 12.—The war against England, according to the German newspapers received here, will commence at the end of October after Antwerp has fallen. Belgium will then become the base of operations against Great Britain, the newspapers say. They add that Admiral von Tirpitz, the minister of the navy, who is now at general headquarters with the Kaiser, has announced that he will go aboard the flagship of the German fleet and direct the operations of the navy.

ANTWERP MAY BE SOURCE OF WEAKNESS

It Will Mean Vast Extension to Lines of German Defence.

London, Oct. 12.—German talk about using Antwerp as a naval base and for aerial attacks on England makes little impression in well-informed circles here. Any breach of the neutrality of the Scheldt waters by Germany would also until Britain's hands, with unquestioned advantage to the power holding the North Sea. Moreover, the Zeppelins have now been proved to be so vulnerable to British aircraft attack that a German attack on London could at best have little more than spectacular results. What Lieutenants Collet and Spencer Grey have done at Dusseldorf, other plucky young British airmen are eager and ready to emulate elsewhere.

The main military result of the German entrance into Antwerp is the extension of the German front, involving the retention in the west of such a vast force as will make Russia's task in the east all the easier. Moreover, the immediate fate of Antwerp really depends on the result of the battle now proceeding on the line from Lassigny to Lens and the other operations in Northern France.

INTERNED IN HOLLAND. German Division as Well as British Brigade Crosses the Frontier.

London, Oct. 12.—An undated dispatch received by Reynolds Weekly says that, according to Belgian soldiers near the Dutch frontier, a German division unwittingly crossed the border into Holland and has been interned.

The Hague, Oct. 12.—The Comant gives some details of the arrival of 2,000 British and 500 Belgian soldiers on Dutch soil after their departure from Antwerp. It says: "The British soldiers crossed into Holland near Clinge because they were cut off from the main body and they are now interned near Koewart. Five hundred Belgians, also were disarmed. The men appeared greatly fatigued and some were badly wounded." "Thirty-six Belgians were interned at Rilland-Bath. About 500 Belgian artillerymen crossed into Holland near Putten. They were interned at Assen. Among these were twenty wounded. Two hundred were interned at Suyskill and fifty at Sas. There are no figures available of the casualties among the Germans, Belgians and British, but it is thought that they are heavy."
