

TRADING WITH ENEMY.

Amendments to Former Proclamations Add Insurance and Reinsurance.

Ottawa, Oct. 23 .- Amendments to the two royal proclamations issued respecting trading with the enemy have been made and are published this week by the government. They relate chiefly to the making of insurance or reinsurance contracts with the enemy or for his benefit.

It is forbidden to make or enter into marine, life or other policy or contract of insurance or reinsurance, with or for the benefit of an enemy; to accept from or give effect to any insurance or any risk arising under any policy entered into for the benefit of an enemy before the outbreak of war, and in particular as regards contracts of reinsurance current at the outbreak of war in which the enemy is interested; to cede or accept from him any risk arising from the policy of insurance entered into after the outbreak of

When the enemy has a branch locally situated in British, Allied or neutral territory, carrying on an insurance or reinsurance business, transactions of such branch will be considered transactions with the enemy."


