CONSTANTINOPLE REPORTS 14,000 BRITISH ALONG SUEZ CANAL

London, Oct. 29 .- The British government, during the last few days, has sent numerous territorial troops to Egypt, according to news received from well informed quarters in Constantinople, says a Reuter dispatch from Constantinople, via Berlin.

"Fourteen thousand troops," says the dispatch, "have been stationed along the Suez Canal."

"In Turkfsh diplomatic circles the concentration of British troops in Egypt is much discussed and declared to be an infringement of neutrality. It is pointed out that the consent of the Porte is necessary for all loans, but this was not obtained for the loan of \$25,000,000, destined for agricultural purposes in Egypt."


