"I don't see how there can help being a great reaction after this war is over. Private individuals used to fight when they had differences, but now they go to the courts. I sincerely hope to see the day when nations will settle their differences in the same way. There can be an international police force created to enforce decisions of the courts."

Speaking of Germany's part in the war, Mr. Carnegie said he believed the Emperor was as ill is now. He expressed great sympathy for the Emperor and said he knew his "heart must be broken" over the break in his peaceful reign.

When Mr. Carnegie spoke of the horrors of the war his voice quavered and tears appeared in his eyes.
