FRANCIS JOSEPH MAY DIE THIS TIME

Rome, Dec. 24.—It is reported here that Emperor Francis Joseph of Austria is dying. He has received the last sacrament of his Church.

FIRST FRENCH COURT INSTALLED AT THANN

Touching Ceremony in the Reconquered Alsatian Town.

Paris, Dec. 23.—The first French court in the conquered territory at Thann, Alsace, has just been installed. The simple ceremonial was dramatic. The courtroom was crowded with girls in picturesque Alsatian costumes, and old men who had waited forty odd years for the day when France should return to Alsace.

The courtroom was silent until the guard of honor of dragoons, posted back of the dais, drew their sabres at the word of command from their officers. Another officer then entered the room, advanced to the judge's desk, and in solemn tones proclaimed:

"In the name of the French people—"

The low sobbing of an old Alsatian, unable to restrain his emotion, interrupted the officer, but after a short pause, he continued: "And by virtue of the instruction from the general commanding the First Army, we declare Monsieur — judge in Thann, with jurisdiction."

That was all. The young people rushed cheering into the street, while the old men remained for a while in their places in quiet ecstasy.

SCANDINAVIAN TRIPLE ALLIANCE IN FORGATION

Petrograd, Dec. 23.—Via London—The Russian press is convinced that the formation of a triple alliance may be announced at any time as the result of the conference at Malmoe, Sweden, last week, of King Haakon, King Gustav and King Christian.

The newspapers express the opinion that such an alliance could not possibly be a source of danger to Russia. They state that a concert of the Scandinavian powers would allay all apprehension concerning the possible pro-German sympathies of Sweden.

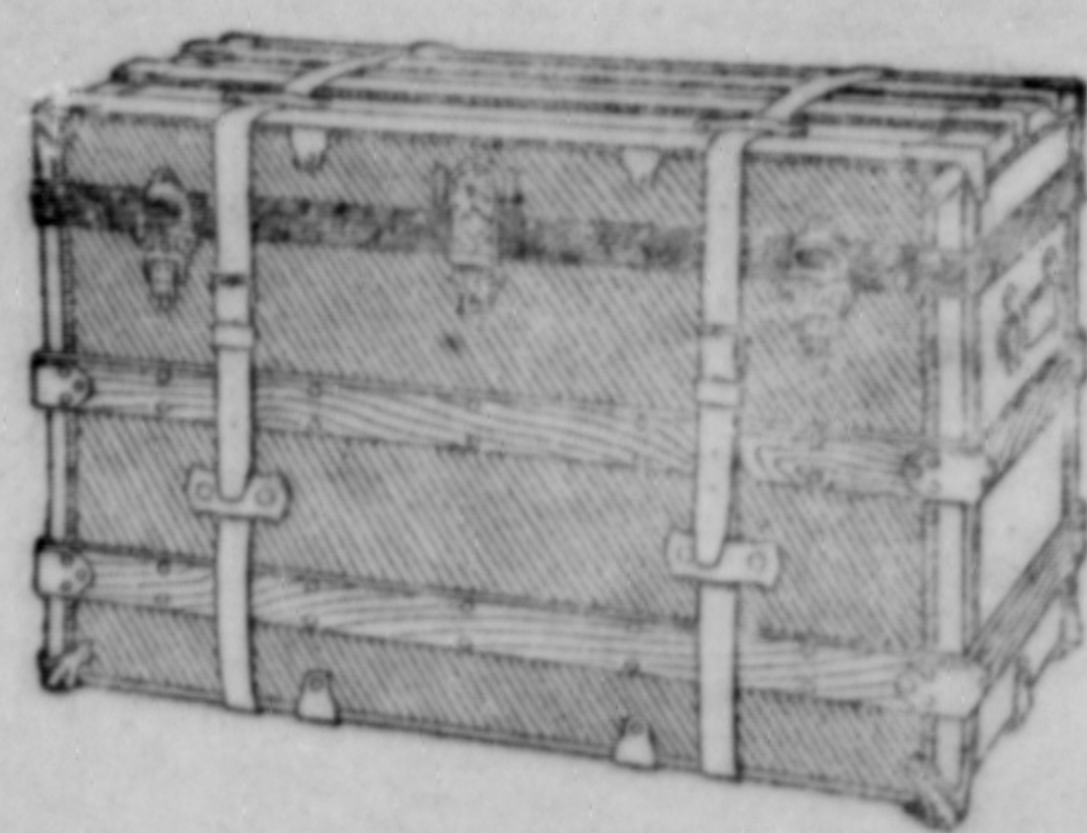

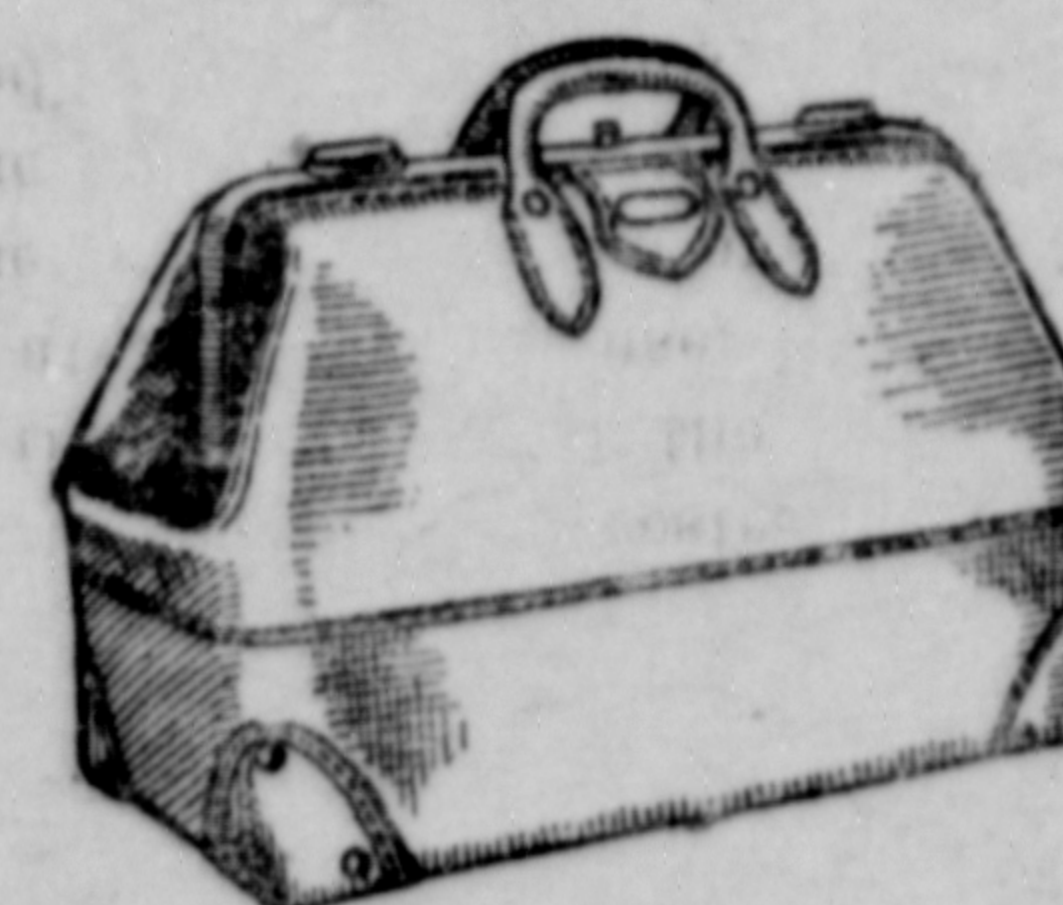
