**Hopes to Get It From the Krupps and Other Such German Firms.**

London, Feb. 19.—German financiers have been summoned to a conference in Berlin with the Finance Minister, who considers that a new loan of \$1,250,000,000 is required for the continuance of the war, says a dispatch from Amsterdam to the Exchange Telegraph Company.

It is hoped that a large portion of this loan, the message adds, will be subscribed by the Krupps and other leading German firms in exchange for the new war materials.
