

Pekin, March 16 .- At a conference in Pekin between representatives of Japan and China concerning the demands made upon China by Japan and presented at Pekin shortly after the Japanese occupation of Kiauchau, the Japanese delegates showed a conciliatory attitude. They made slight concessions from the letter of their demands as previously presented.

A compromise was reached in the matter of the railroad and mining concessions in South Manchuria, but it was agreed that Japanese should have the preference in future railroad loans and the right to prospect for mines for a fixed period and operate a large proportion of the mining *** * * * properties so discovered.


