As exchange declines, this makes the operation of selling our securities increasing profitable for holders in foreign countries. This inducement of a profit in exchange, among other inducements, has been causing heavy selling from Germany for some time. The German low rate of exchange which has prevailed gives the seller there about ten points profit, with the price of 4 marks, equal to around 84 cents -whereas the par rate is 95 cents. To give this same rate in English profit, exchange on London would have to sink to around 4.50. The rate would probably decline to those figures if nothing vere done, unless very much heavier selling of our securities from London came in to adjust the balance.

Hardship to Exporters.

But low rates are a hardship to some of our exporters if they have to stand the exchange-that is, if their contracts are not based on dollar exchange. And this circumstance, it is said, has already diminished copper sales, but food and war supplies Europe must have even if she bears the brunt of exchange against her.

Consequently, the logical thing would be for England to establish credit here-that is, to make a loan.
