NEW SUBMARINE HAS NO PERISCOPE

According to reports received at The Hague (says the London Evening News correspondent) from Hamburg, Stettin, and other German shipbuilding centres, the German Admiralty, under Admiral Canelle, are making extraordinary efforts to force the rapid construction of submarines.

Building yards are working day and night at high pressure.

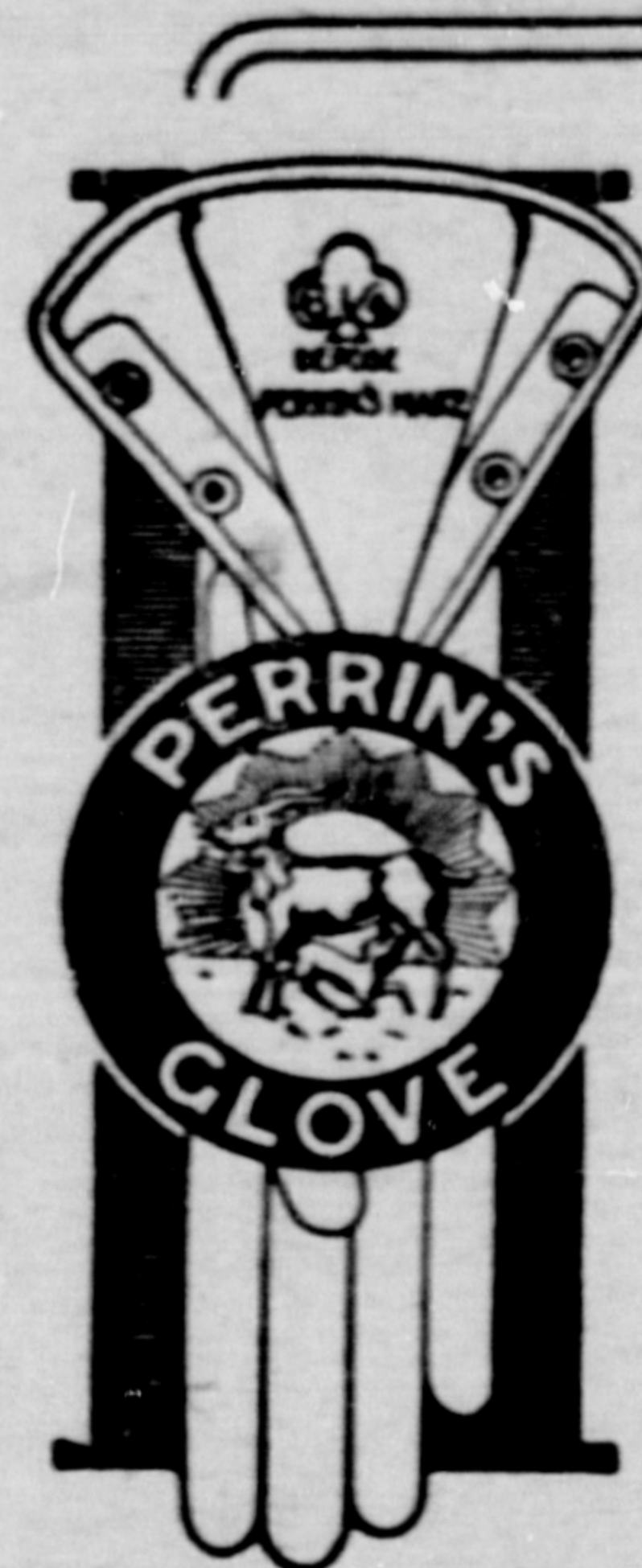
The naval expert of the Dutch weekly De Landstorm learns that the Germans are now devoting their attention to the construction of a submarine of a new type in which no periscope is used.

An ingenious arrangement of lenses and mirrors built into the hull of the boat on both sides enables the submarine commander to take the necessary observations.

Vessels equipped with the new device are obliged to keep somewhat closer to the surface than the ordinary submarine, but this disadvantage, it is said, is more than offset by the fact that there is no protruding periscope to attract the attention of ships some distance away.
