## PANAMA CANAL MEANS MUCH TO PRINCE RUPERT

Mr. Wm. H. Magee, Special Correspondent of the London Daily Telegraph and an Authority on the Panama Canal is in Town—May Give Lecture on Subject Here

Mr. W. H. Magee who is in the city now, has lectured and written extensively about the Panama Canal, both in this continent and in England. It is possible he may lecture on the subject while here. The Board of Trade executive are considering arrangements this afternoon. As the Panama Canal will be completed at about the same time as the Grand Trunk Pacific Railway, and will mean a great deal to coastal trade, its bearing upon the future development of Prince Rupert is very great, says Mr. Magee, who looks for the time when fleets will be sailing from Prince Rupert direct to Europe by way of the Panama Canal.
