

SAW HIS GHOST AS LOVER DIED

Montreal, Oct. 20.—A tragic death befell Robert Wills, an employee of the Canada Rubber Company at Montreal, yesterday in connection with which a strange story is told. The young man came in contact with a live wire carrying a heavy power load and was almost instantly struck dead. At the very moment of his death, his fiancée, Miss Winifred Hughes, says she became conscious of the ghostly presence of her lover standing behind her. The apparition caused her to fear that some harm had befallen him.

The young couple had made all arrangements to be married at this coming Christmas.

TO REORGANIZE CATHOLIC CHURCH

Important Changes Contemplated in the Ecclesiastical Provinces in England.

Rome, Oct. 20.—An important reorganization of the Catholic Church in England has been decided upon, and a Papal bull will shortly be issued dividing England into three ecclesiastical provinces with archiepiscopal sees at Liverpool, Birmingham and Westminster. Two new dioceses will also be formed, one out of a portion of Liverpool and the other out of the actual diocese of Northampton, with its see in Cambridge. Thus the great see of Westminster will be considerably reduced in dignity, as, instead of fourteen suffragan sees, as, now it will have only four.

Owen Wister Dead

Cleveland, O., Oct. 20.—While his wife was rushing westward to his deathbed on a special train Owen Wister, author of "The Virginian," died in Wyoming. Mrs. Wister was attending the state federation of women's clubs, when the news of her husband's serious illness reached her.

"NEWTON" OF TORONTO

Alderman Objecting to Wood Poles in the Queen City

Alderman Maguire is evidently the Alderman Newton of Toronto city council. He called the attention of the council recently to "the unsightly wooden poles" which the Toronto Hydro-Electric system proposed to erect on Yonge street north of Wood street.

"The merchants there want to buy light and power from the city," he declared, "but they say that they will not do so if the city puts those ugly wooden poles on their street."

Mayor Geary stated that the matter of putting tall wooden poles on business streets was engaging the attention of the commission, who would make a report to council in the near future.
