**FRENCH PROPHETESS PREDICTS THAT WAR WILL END ON NOV. 7**

Paris, Oct. 2.—The famous Paris prophetess, Mme. De Thees, has added to her reputation enormously by predictions in her annual almanac, published in January, stating that an European war would break out about midyear, preceded by a sensational trial; that the Pope would die probably after hostilities began; that the Germans would get near Paris without penetrating it; giving subsequent prophecies that the German Emperor would be killed September 29, the French would enter Germany October 29, and the war would end November 7.

**OFFICERS GO WEST TO GET VOLUNTEERS**

Pass Through Toronto on Way From Valcartier to Recruit Second Corps.

Toronto, Oct. 2.—No time is being lost in the formation of a second Canadian contingent to the war zone. A dozen officers, specially chosen from the men at Valcartier, passed through the city last night on the way to Western Canada to recruit men for the second regiments. These officers were on their way to points from Winnipeg to Vancouver.

Sergeant Armstrong, of Red Deer, informed The Globe that they would try to gather as many men as possible during the next few weeks to make up the 19,000 for the second contingent. He was pleased with Valcartier, declaring that the men there had received a good training. The Vancouver express carried all the men. Others will arrive shortly to recruit in the Ontario centers.

**GERMANS ARE MAKING A DETERMINED EFFORT TO INVEST ANTWERP**

Ghent, Oct. 1.—The German efforts to invest Antwerp appear to have become more strenuous and determined. Their lines extend westward nearly into this city, and their artillery is hard at work on the south bank of the Scheldt, seven miles away. Railway service south of here has been stopped altogether. There is, however, still ground for the hope that the city itself will escape a direct attack.

Brussels has been completely cut off and is occupied by a largely reinforced German garrison.

**SUBMARINE THAT BLEW UP BRITISH CRUISERS SAID TO BE UNINJURED**

London, Oct. 2.—A dispatch received by the Reuter Telegram Company from Amsterdam stated that the German consul there, according to the newspaper Telegraf, has been advised by his government that submarine U-9, which is credited with having blown up the three British cruisers in the North Sea, has returned to a German port uninjured.

Old Colony Is Again Talking Confederation With Canada.

St. Johns, Nfld., Oct. 2.—Not in twenty years has there been so much talk in press circles and by the fireside of confederation with the Dominion as there is at present. A growing majority is strongly in favor of making the question a really serious political issue in the Island.
