THE FREEDOM OF THE SEAS FOR FISHING

"The sea should be free to all men of the country to exploit within the three mile limit," was advocated by Capt. James Stewart of Vancouver, in an interview published in The Province in a recent issue. "Let every man who is prepared to equip himself with the necessary gear go fishing when and where he chooses. The only government restrictions necessary are those to prevent the depletion of the spawning grounds and catching fish out of season. These laws should be administered by a Fisheries Board composed of practical men of British Columbia."

Captain Stewart thinks that Ottawa is incapable of handling the Pacific fisheries at such a distance. In this, he is not alone in his opinion. The headquarters of the Fisheries Board are too far away, and they are out of touch with conditions as they exist here. They are dependent for their point of view upon the members of the Advisory Board, who may be fishermen, but more often are not, and upon their local officials, who are not necessarily fishermen either.

"Do away with concessions or licences," continued Capt. Stewart, "and we shall soon have a development of the industry. Concessions are an absolute bar to development. I really fail to see why this government should claim any right to exact money out of the men of this country for either fishing concessions or licences to fish."




