#### General Hospital in

Poor Financial Condition.

The General Hospital is headed direct for bankruptcy. With the increased cost of living an effort was made to run the institution without increasing the cost to the community. This of course failed. Householders are aware that the cost of housekeeping has doubled in the last few years, and as the conduct of the hospital is to a large extent a matter of housekeeping, the cost has increased there just as everywhere else.

The Board has at last come to a realization of its condition and is preparing to deal with it courageously. Strenuous efforts are to be made to restore the finances of the instution to a sound basis and the people of the city are being asked to aid in that laudable work.

We are bound to keep up a good hospital. It is one of the necessaries of our modern life, unfortunately. It is also necessary that we provide free of charge for those who are unable to pay. With many people it is hard enough to pay for living expenses without having to pay hospital and doctor when ill and the income is stopped. That is where the city and the province step in. They provide largely for the upkeep of the institution. What private persons cannot pay, they must. It is their bounden duty. It is as much a charge on the community as keeping up the roads.

#### Fishing Season was

Not a Success.

The big part of the halibut fishing season is over. All records have been made and some of the smaller boats will soon retire for the winter. At such a time it is well to look back and see what is wrong with the industry.

Quite near the beginning of the season when the big catches were being made the strike stopped the fishing, as the longshoremen and the fish packers refused to handle the catches. That was the first spoke in the wheel of progress. The same cause acting indirectly prevented a supply of ice being put up at the cold storage and the result was that early in the season the the "Land Registry Act" with amendments, ice supply failed, and boats were much delayed in getting enough to take with them to the fishing grounds. Then there was a car shortage. This was largely the result of the financial condition of the railroad, which is at present in the hands of a receiver.

All these matters will have to be righted another year if the fishing season is to be a success. There must be plenty of ice, bait and cars. These things are essentials. It is also very desirable that proper accommodation be provided for the fishermen at the port. We are told just now that boats are going south to winter. If there was a good laying up site here, many would winter at this port. The Dominion Government should be urged , to proceed at once with the construction of fishermen's docks in to the above-mentioned lands, in the name order that there may be a properly protected place where the small vessels can lie throughout the winter without great expense and in perfect security.
