Why We Said Railway Had Been Acquired.

Someone inquires how we said the Canadian Government had acquired the Grand Trunk Railway when the matter of taking over the line was still being discussed in parliament and the change being strongly opposed.

Anyone who asks a question of that kind does not fully] understand the method of government in this country. The Canadian Cabinet has decided to take over the line. In all probability they have discussed the question beforehand in a private Lot Nine (9), Block Thirty-one (31), caucus of the members of the party in Parliament. At anyrate (May 923) they have confidence that their action will be supported by Parliament or they would not have committed themselves to so important a measure. Should Parliament decide not to complete the deal, there would be nothing for the Government to do but resign.

The Liberal party has decided to oppose the transfer of the is numbered 427railway. If they can show the House of Commons that they are right and can induce them to vote according to their convictions the measure will be defeated. As they have already been consulted and have made up their minds, there is hardly any possibility for a change of policy now.

There is one other possibility in connection with an important measure such as this. If the country was very strongly opposed to it, meetings would be called and resolutions passed requesting the Government to stay its hand. Delegations migh go to Ottawa to protest and the newspapers might howl in big headlines. Should it be shown that these objections were from the country as a whole and not only from the opposition party the Government would be justified in backing down or the Governor might well refuse to sign the bill after it was passed.

Many Opposed to Government Policy.

In accepting the fact that the deal has been made, the Daily News had no intention of agreeing with the policy. On more than one occasion we expressed the opinion that it would be well to try out the experiment of government ownership of a transcontinental railway with the Canadian Northern which has been already acquired. We must admit, however, that the Government was in a difficult position. It could not allow the railway to shut the above matter on the 9th day of Octodown, as was proposed by the Company and the feeling is strong against paying the deficit year after year. A strong government with a wise leader might have evolved a policy, but the present leaders have not shown any flashes of brilliancy and there seems nothing to do but accept the naevitable.

Businessmen Pleased With Prospect Here.

A businessman who was in the city yesterday with the purpose of deciding whether his firm would open here, said that the town looked very good to him and he intended to recommend favorably. He said that compared with towns of five to six thousand on the prairies there seemed just as much doing here, and day of October, A.
