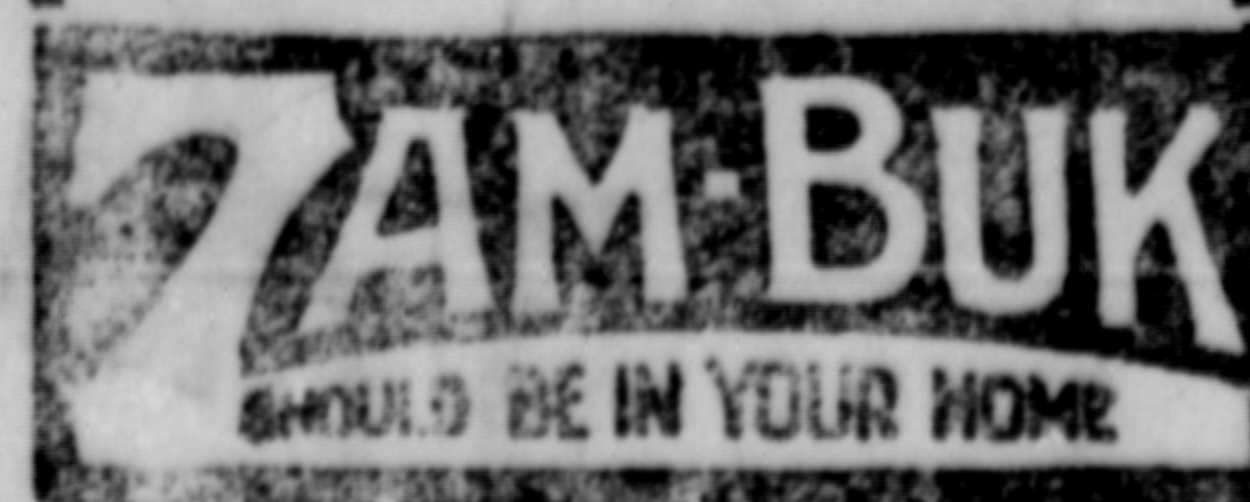

## PRINCE RUPERT IS CITY OF DISTINCTION

So Says Well Known Writer Who Was Here Recently, in an Article in the Toronto Globe.

An article on Prince Rupert appeared a few days ago in the Toronto Globe under large headlines and signed with the initials S. J. D. These initials stand for Sarah Jeannette Duncan, the writer of novels and movie plays, and that lady is better known here as Mrs. E. G. Cotes, whose husband is the owner of the new block where the Teetzel music store is located, and who is now travelling with the Prince of Wales throughout Canada and the United States with a party of journalists.

### The Adventure.

The article which is interesting throughout, is in part as follows:

"In Prince Rupert we find the answer to the question that holds the mind all the way from Winnipeg, perhaps from Toronto, stirring uneasily under the matchless beauty of the journey, the comfort of the train, the civility of the service, the persistent prosaic question whether the great adventure was worth while. That is the character, that clings to it, with its romantic name. Thrust out to battle with the winds of the Pacific, as Vancouver was once thrust out, the little city has a challenging air, as one who would say to depreciators: 'Have at you!' Prince Rupert is a seated city, not a perched, or a clinging one, or one that sprawls untidily into slums. Already, while she is the merest clever sketch of what she will be, that gives her a dignity.

### A City of Distinction.

"High on the sheer face of her harbor, she has not an accidental nor an unplanned line. The brilliantly able town-planners of Boston, who were finally chosen to shape her personality, used the originality of her natural position to give her a distinction which she can never lose, and her taxpayers a yearly bill which they cannot lose either. But there are certain things that cannot be had for nothing, and doubtless the people of Rupert, when they vote the repairs of their trestled roadways, think of this. Plank walks are the rule in the West that is being born under; the shadow of the spruce, but Rupert is more extensively and luxuriously planked than concrete minds could dream. The forest has literally laid itself down in her service and for miles the town is served with broad timbered roads and bridges over which the grocer's flivver dashes gaily, and the pedestrian goes dry shod in any weather. As the city prospers this temporary condition is changing and several of the main streets are now filled up in the ordinary way, but it has lasted long enough to establish the motor rather than the horse for private and the auto-bus for public transit. Rupert will probably never suffer the rigid indignity of street car lines or the hideous noise of their warning gongs. She will move delicately instead on her own gasoline, both ashore and afloat. For whatever the competition of her streets and avenues, Prince Rupert's Mall will always be her harbor.

### A Beautiful Harbor.

"Clear and deep, and just a mile across, island-dotted and mountain guarded, this harbor is one of the most beautiful thoroughfares in the world. The summer evening life of the city is all there. The opulent citizen of Rupert may possess a motor car, he will certainly possess a gasoline launch.

And there is more than a hint of Venice in the sight when one looks out across the sun-set water, cleft with the long following lines of the little pleasure boats among the incoming fishing craft or the passenger steamer from Vancouver and Alaska. The harbor is vocal too. All day long it speaks to the city with one or another well-remembered voice, and the inhabitants say 'That's the "John," or "That's the "Mary." All sorts of craft on all sorts of business—bringing up pulp from Swanson Bay, lumber from Ocean Falls, to load for the East. Among them the other day a leviathan of 8,800 tons built in Vancouver for the coasting trade, the "War Company." No doubt Rupert went down five thousand strong to look at the "War Company" in dock, while in imagination they tweaked the noses, so to speak, of the great Oriental traders that will one day, and that soon, warp themselves alongside.

### Impudent Siren.

"There is a general note of hope and defiance in the harbor. Its most lively expression is omitted by the impudent siren of a little common carrier named the "Alice B." "O-hy-O!" shrills the Alice B., entering or departing. 'You can't deny shipping to a harbor like this, O-hy-O!'
