## VICTORIA'S MAYOR VISITS THIS CITY

Returning From Prince of Wales' Banquet, He Speaks appreciatively of the Trip.

Mayor Porter of Victoria who spent yesterday in the city, went south last evening on the Camosun. He is returning from a visit to Winnipeg where he attended the Prince of Wales' banquet.

Mr. Porter was much interested in Prince Rupert and in its future. The scenery and accommodation on the G. T. P. appealed to him strongly and he says that next summer he intends to bring his wife and make a trip through the country and see everything.

Speaking of the political contest in Victoria, Mr. Porter said it was surprising what opposition was developing to the candidature of Hon. S. F. Tolmie. Personally Dr. Tolmie was popular but he was being opposed because of his associations. "If there had been a strong local candidate he would have found it difficult to secure re-election," said Mr. Porter. As it is Mr. Barnard is a stranger to Victoria people and can hardly succeed.

## TRAFALGAR DAY IS NAVY LEAGUE TAG

Daughters of the Empire to Aid Local Organization in Making Collection for Sailors.

The Navy League has enlisted the services of the local Daughters of the Empire to aid them in making a collection for the funds of the League on Trafalgar Day, which is Tuesday of next week.

The idea of the fund is to help train boys for the navy, to look after dependents of the tars who fight the battles of the country and to help keep up the various Seamen's Institutes and other organizations which cater to the needs of the sailors when in port. The local organization has J. H. McMullen for president and E. H. Mortimer for secretary-treasurer.

## OFFICE BUILDING FOR ALBERT & M'CAFFERY

The new office building for Albert & McCaffery at their wharf is nearing completion. The building is about 20 ft. by 30 ft. and will cost in the neighborhood of \$2,500. It is two storeys in height and the main floor will be used for a very commodious office while the upper floor will be used as living quarters for the office staff.

## Synopsis of Land Act Amendments

Minimum price of first-class land reduced to \$5 an acre; second-class to \$2.50 an acre.

Pre-emption now confined to surveyed lands only. Records will be granted covering only land suitable for agricultural purposes and which is non-timber land.

Partnership pre-emptions abolished, but parties of not more than four may arrange for adjacent pre-emptions with joint residence, but each making necessary improvements on respective claims.

Pre-emptors must occupy claims for five years and make improvements to value of \$10 per acre, including clearing and cultivation of at least 5 acres.

Where pre-emption in occupation not less than 5 years, and has made proportionate improvements, he may, because of ill-health, or other cause, be granted immediate certificate of improvement and transfer his claim.

Records without permanent residence may be issued, provided applicant makes improvements to extent of \$500 per annum and records same each year. Failure to make improvements or record same will operate as forfeiture.

Title cannot be obtained in less than 5 years. Improvements of \$10.00 per acre, including 5 acres cleared and cultivated, and residence of at least 2 years are required.

Pre-emptor holding Crown grant may record another pre-emption, if he requires land in conjunction with his farm, without actual occupation, provided statutory improvements made and residence maintained on Crown granted land.

Unsurveyed areas, not exceeding 20 acres, may be leased immediately; title to be obtained after fulfilling residential and improvement conditions.

For grazing and industrial purposes areas exceeding 20 acres may be leased by one person or company. Mill, factory or industrial sites on timber land not exceeding 40 acres may be purchased; conditions include payment of stumpage.

Natural hay meadows inaccessible by existing roads may be purchased on terms upon construction of a road to them. Rebate of one-half of cost of road, not exceeding half of purchase price, is made.

PRE-EMPTORS' FREE GRANTS ACT.

The scope of this Act is enlarged to include persons joining and serving with His Majesty's Forces. The time within which the heirs or devisees of a deceased pre-emptor may apply from for one year after the death of such person, as formerly, until one year after the conclusion of the present war. This privilege is also made retroactive.

No fees relating to pre-emptions are due or payable by soldiers on pre-emptions recorded after June 26, 1918. Taxes are remitted for five years.

Provision for return of money accrued, due and been paid since August 4, 1914, on account of payments, fees or taxes on soldiers' pre-emptions.

Interest on agreements to purchase town or city lots held by members of Allied Forces, or dependents, acquired direct or indirect, remitted from enlistment to March 31, 1920.

SUB-PURCHASERS OF CROWN LANDS.

Provision made for issuance of Crown grants to sub-purchasers of Crown lands, acquiring rights from purchasers who failed to complete purchase, involving forfeiture, on fulfillment of conditions of purchase, interest and taxes. Where sub-purchaser does not claim whole of original parcel, purchase price due and taxes may be distributed proportionately over whole area. Applications must be made by May 1, 1920.

GRAZING.

Grazing Act, 1919, for systematic development of livestock industry provides for grant districts and range administration under Commissioner. Annual grazing permits issued based on numbers ranged; priority for establishment of range given to owners may form Associations for range management. Free, or partially free, permits for settlers, campers or travellers, up to ten head.
