

SPORT CHAT

Bobby Jones has contracted to make twelve reels on how he plays golf, for the movie industry. His pay is said to be \$250,000, enough to send most of us, no doubt, into reels, strathspeys, flings and spins. Jones, has agreed to make those reels showing exactly how he makes all those golf shots which he seemed to do with such perfection as to be almost mechanical. If anyone wishes to imitate him after seeing the films that will be all right. But Jones is not going in for golf instruction. He will depict Bobby as Bobby plays golf.

The double major penalty for putting an opponent with a stick has been wiped from the books of the National Hockey League here. The rule which has been in force only since the opening of the 1930-31 season has been legislated out of existence. In its place will be a rule distinguishing between intentional and unintentional slashes. Unintentionally cutting an opponent will draw for the offender five minutes in the penalty box, as in former years, while deliberately slashing a player about the head will bring the offender a 20-minute match penalty. The rule abolished called for a ten-minute penalty for all cuts, regardless of whether they were intentional or unintentional. Strict enforcement had met with disfavor in most league cities. Representatives of Detroit, Boston, and Chicago Clubs voted for its retention, and the New York Rangers, New York Americans, Toronto, Philadelphia and Montreal voted for its abolition. The Canadiens and Ottawa were not represented.

NEW EXPERIMENT WITH CRIMINALS

Young to Be Kept Away From Old In British Prisons

CHELMSFORD, Eng., Dec. 8.—When Chelmsford Prison, which has been closed as a penal establishment since the beginning of the war, is reopened shortly, new experiments will be tried in the reformation of young criminals. It will be reserved for convicts between the ages of 20 and 30, who will be taken from Dartmoor and the Isle of Wight, to prevent them from association with confirmed criminals.

CANADIENS BEAT YANKS

Montreal Squad Now Leading Canadian Division With Ottawa — Hawks Defeat Detroit

NEW YORK, Dec. 8.—The Montreal Canadiens, champions of the hockey world, regained a tie with Toronto for first place in the Canadian Division of the National Hockey League by defeating New York Americans 3 to 2 last night. The Canadiens had a clear margin of superiority throughout the most of the game.

At Chicago, twelve thousand fans went to the stadium to see the rushing Black Hawks battled almost to a standstill by the rejuvenated Detroit Falcons but the Hawks were able to stall off a rousing finishing drive by Detroit in the final period to emerge with a 3 to 2 victory.

BUCKS ARE ON TOP NOW

Took Pacific Coast Hockey Lead By Defeating Tacoma Last Night

PORTLAND, Dec. 8.—The local hockey team took the lead in the Coast League race by defeating Tacoma four to two Sunday night in a game which was featured by wild playing in the final period during which three of the goals were scored.

VANCOUVER, Dec. 8.—"The road to success is full of women pushing their husbands ahead," declared Lieutenant Governor R. Randolph Bruce, in paying tribute to the Women's Auxiliary, which was largely responsible for the completion (free of debt) of the Canadian National Institute for the Blind.
