

The famous Erie canal was opened in 1825, has a length of 363 miles, a width of seventy feet and a depth of seven feet, and cost about \$50,000,000. The Illinois and Michigan canal was opened in 1848; it is ninety-six miles long and cost about \$6-000,000. The Chesapeake and Ohio canal is 185 miles in length and cost about \$12,000,000. The Wabash and Erie is 274 miles in length.

The Suez canal was opened in 1869, and is ninety-nine miles long, 420 feet wide at its surface, and thirty-one feet deep. Its cost was about \$100,000,000. The Manchester canal, 1894, is about thirty-six miles in length, 300 feet wide and twenty-six feet deep. Its cost was about \$75,000,000. The North Sea and Baltic is sixtyone miles long and 220 feet wide and cost \$30,000,000.


