NO STANDING COMMITTEE

Vernor Harcourt's Proposal is Withdrawn.

London, June 9.—At the Imperial Conference this morning Vernor Harcourt's proposal for a standing committee consisting of the Colonial high commissioners and five representatives from the home office was withdrawn. The proposal was to make the committee an advisory one, and not executive, therefore there was no necessity to confer voting powers. Sir Wilfrid Laurier who opposed it said he viewed with serious apprehension the interference of anybody whatever between the home government and the government of the Dominions. He adhered to the position he took four years ago, that the relations between the Dominions and the Mother Country should be carried on by themselves.
