CLEAR OX TAIL SOUP

Nourishing Soups Made

Clear oxtail is a delicious soup, and is made in the following man-Spring Beds, clean White Sheets 25c ner. Procure an oxtail, and ask the butcher to joint it. Put BEST IN TOWN FOR THE MONEY it in a saucepan half full of cold water, and just bring it to the boil, then throw the water away. Fry the pieces of tail in two ounces of butter, and when good brown, wipe them with a cloth wrung out in hot water, and put them in a saucepan with one quart of stock. The stock should have been made the day before SPECIAL +~~~~~~~~~~~ with two pounds of lean beef and two quarts of water, and must be flavored with onion, carrot, a little turnip, and celery. It must also have been well strained and entirely freed from grease when cold. 
