CHING CHING BORDEN'S CHINESE CRY

Five thousand years ago, the Chinese were the leading people of the world. They led in civilization, in art, in laws, in ethics, and in wealth. When our own ancestors were wild barbarians living in caves, the Chinese were enjoying a high civilization. The reason they lost their place in the conflict for supremacy was owing to a wrong economic theory. They were believers in "protection."

The Chinese carried the protection theory to perfection. That is why it killed them so effectually as a national power. They did not stop with a mere tariff wall. They built an actual wall of solid masonry in order to keep trade out. They were great believers in the idea of "China for the Chinese."

Within the last ten years their eyes have been opened. They have discarded the old idea of "China for the Chinese." They are encouraging trade today. They realise that if they are to become wealthy again it can only be by selling their coal, iron, silks, camphor, tea, ginger and other products to those nations who need them.

But the false idea of trade which the Chinese have thrown away has not been lost. It has been picked up by some of the disconsolate and haphazard politicians of Canada. They polished it up to look like new, and put it out as their own idea. But the only change in it is that they have made it read "Canada for the Canadians" instead of "China for the Chinese." The theory is the same.

Mr. Borden is among those who raised the cry. Little men among his desperate bunch of followers take it up occasionally. Not that they are all fools. Some of them may be knaves.

The fact is that when "Canada for the Canadians" was practised—when Canada was exclusively held by the Canadian aborigines—it was not an important or desirable country at all. It was only when the French and English settlers came that the country started to become wealthy or desirable. The increasing wealth and strength of the Dominion comes directly as a consequence of the welcoming of settlers, and the extension of our markets.

Its future growth in wealth and strength depends entirely on our

continuing to welcome the stranger and to extend our markets. A nation cannot live to itself.

Because British Columbia is the least developed of all the provinces of Canada, she can least of all afford to tolerate the fool philosophy of "Canada for the Canadians."

We have enormous lumber areas for which we desire markets. Are we only to be permitted to sell to the local market?

We have fisheries at the doors of Prince Rupert big enough to feed a continent. Are we to be permitted to sell our fish only to the local buyers in the city?

The reciprocity proposals will perform a great service for the people of Canada by removing the taxes from the food they eat. But they will perform an even greater service by opening up a market of ninety million people for our timber, our fish, and our mineral wealth. Laurier and larger markets have brought prosperity to Canada. Laurier and larger markets will continue to ensure a continued prosperity.

Our anti-reciprocity freaks should go and learn something from the statesmen of China. They know better now.

FOUR CRAZY MEN

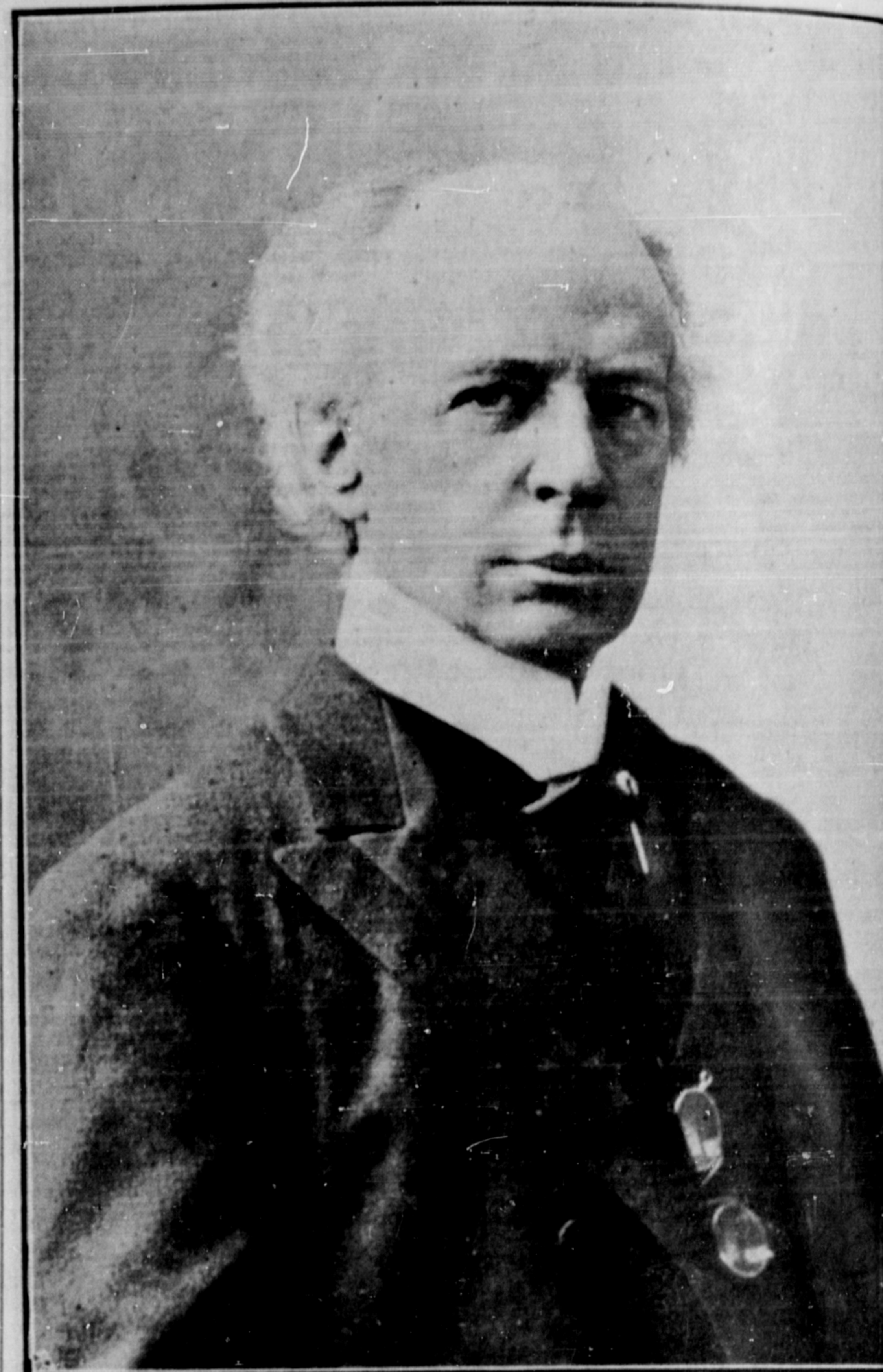
In charge of Mounted Police They Were Going Below Yesterday.
