Progressive Indians

The astonishment of strangers can be better understood, on their visiting the Indian villages, when it is stated that the natives show them their schoolhouses and churches; their town halls and wellkept streets; their co-operative stores and gasoline launches; their well-dressed women and children and the sanitary arrangements to preserve health. In each town can be heard the gramaphone and on the streets the uniformed! bands play selections, during the summer evenings. It may well be said that the advancement of is one of the marvels of the present century.
