#### BRITISH RAILWAY STRIKES ARE SPREADING

#### (Canadian Press Despatch)

London, Aug. 15.—Sectional strikes of railwaymen were declared last night at Manchester, Liverpool, Sheffield and other places. Some of the railway lines have already given notice of their inability to adequately handle freight traffic.

There now appears little hope of averting a great railroad strike which probably will be accompanied by a general labor revolt that will have a tremendous effect on the trade of the United Kingdom.

At a meeting today of managers of all the railroads having terminals in London, it was decided that the time had arrived to resist the men's encroachments. The managers contended that the men by striking have violated the agreement arrived at after the railway troubles of 1907, under which all disputes were to be referred to conciliation boards or to arbirtation.

At Liverpool again today the troops were compelled to fire on a mob of strikers. Bayonet charges were also made on the disorderly element. Up to the present details are still lacking as to the number killed or injured.
