THAT 30-DAY SENTENCE

Editor Daily News:—

Assuming that Alderman Casey was correctly quoted in your last night's issue as giving for his reason for opposing an increase in salary for Magistrate McMorde that a young man had been given thirty days for vagrancy in Magistrate McMorde's court, I do not believe that Col. McMorde needs any one to champion his sense of justice as well as kindness toward his fellow man.

This young man in question pled guilty to the charge of vagrancy. He was sentenced to thirty days, which sentence was suspended, and immediately afterward Col. McMorde appealed to me in this man's behalf and secured from me a promise of a job for him at 60 cents per hour. He even arranged that this man be advanced sufficient for his meals and lodging until pay day. I was struck at the time by this exceptional interest and desire that no hardship be inflicted upon this young man and that he be given every chance to help himself. I might add for the information of Alderman Casey that the young man did not show up for work.

I believe that we are fortunate in having in Magistrate McMorde a man with a profound respect for the laws of our land and yet with a personal interest in the unfortunate class who are called before him.

COLONEL EVANS IS NOW AT NEW YORK

Frank S. Evans, who was in partnership with W. Shrubbsall in the fish business here some years ago is now a colonel in the intelligence office of the British army and is located at New York where he lives with his wife at the Waldorf Astoria. Mr. Evans has advanced very rapidly in the army. He left Prince Rupert before the war and enlisted immediately on the outbreak of hostilities. He was wounded no less than three times and was awarded the Distinguished Service Order decoration before he went to the United States. It is expected that he will remain permanently with the War Office.

PACK TRAINS CARRY SUPPLIES TO BABINE

Large pack trains are now leaving Hazelton for the north with winter supplies. On Tuesday a forty horse train set out with all kinds of supplies for Fort Babine which is about fifty miles from Hazelton and is still a Hudson's Bay post. Soon it will be impossible to take freight in there except by dogs and the packers are kept very busy just now rushing supplies in. Each horse packs about 300 pounds and the journey is made in spells, it taking four or five days to make the trip.

Last Sunday two of the younger hunters of the city had a rather stirring experience across the Bay. Sidney Bazzett-Jones and Alex Rix went out in the morning on the trail of the wary deer and, evidently, must have looked too long and too far. At any rate they got lost and stayed out till well into the night when they got their bearings by the moon. Sometimes people lose their bearings by moonlight, but not these hunters. They got no deer but they got home.
