HOSPITAL AND ZYMOTIC ILLS

Lieutenant-Governor May Order Treatment of Certain Infectious Complaints Overruling Hospital Bylaw.

Prince Rupert General Hospital Bylaws have been approved by the Lieutenant-Governor in council. The Provincial Secretary in informing the Hospital Board of this, drew the attention of the Board to the fact that under the Hospitals Act all hospitals receiving a grant from the Government must treat certain cases of infectious illness (excluding very virulent types) under direction of the Lieutenant-Governor. The Provincial Secretary noted that Prince Rupert Hospital Bylaws include a clause stating that no infectious diseases at all could be admitted to the hospital, and pointed out that this was not in order in view of the Lieutenant-Governor's powers in this connection. He requested the Board to take cognizance of this fact. This was agreed to by the President and members with the advice of Mr. C. V. Bennett, and the letter was filed.
