Frank Cassidy, the skip of the famous "Cassidy Rink of curlers, is to leave Vancouver for Winnipeg this winter to take part in the roaring game again. The wonderful performance of Cassidy and his rink two years ago is still fresh in the minds of the curlers all over Canada.

The English Rugby Football season has started in earnest in Manitoba, Saskatchewan, Alberta, British Columbia, and California.

### Boiled Salada Dressing

Two eggs, one tablespoonful water, one tablespoonful butter, one heaping tablespoonful sugar, half teaspoonful mustard, half tea-spoonful salt, and a dust of pepper; mix yolk of eggs, water and vinegar and cook gently; rub together butter, sugar, mustard, salt and pepper and add to other mixture; stir with smooth stick or wooden spoon; beat whites of eggs to a froth and put in last.

### Fall Fashion Notes

White felt hats have come flying over the sea, and their vogue for autumn is undisputed. They are generally simply trimmed with a bow of black velvet or taffeta ribbon.

Rickrack, the old-time serpentine braid that everybody was crazy about a generation ago, has returned, but now it is used for curtain and drapery decoration instead of dress garniture.

In most of the tailored coats of the hour the sleeves are like those of men's, put in without fullness at the top, cut straight and finished off with a small turnback cuff, or a few buttons.

### Grape Marmalade

This is made with the pulp of the grapes and the juice. When the fruit is not abundant it is well to make the marmalade at the same time with the jellies. After draining, rub the fruit pulp through a sieve, add an equal weight of sugar and boil very slowly half or three-quarters of an hour. Stir often to prevent burning.

## WOODWORTH LAKE WATER SUPPLY

Mayor Makes General Statement Showing the Position of the Scheme to Date. Work is About Ready for Contract Letting.

According to a brief general statement of the Woodworth Lake Waterworks scheme, made by the Mayor Monday the work still remains in the hands of the engineering department. A survey party is busy at the lake side preparing for the letting of contracts for the slashing of the timber around the lake. Another part of the work, the pipe line within the limits of the city, is being surveyed by Mr. Newcombe of the city engineering staff, and will shortly be completed so that contracts for excavation may be let.

The Acropolis Hill Reservoir which will employ a number of men within the city, is expected to be ready soon for station gangs or days labor completion as mat be found best.

City Solicitor Peters is going on Saturday to Victoria to ask the Government the right to carry the pipe line through Government land and to cut timber for the construction work. Although the Government has reserved so many inches of water on Woodworth Lake for Prince Rupert, it is necessary to have further permission before the water can be conveyed to the city.

## DIXIE IV. RAN INTO THE CROWD

### Champion Motor Boat Ran Into the Crowd Ashore at Buffalo.

The champion motor boat Dixie IV. ran amuck in the Niagara River during the motor boat races last week and finished up by running high and dry among the crowd that lines a rip rap wall.

Dixie was going 38 miles an hour at the time when her steering gear got foul of a floating plank and she plunged for the shore, where a thousand people were crowded. She drove practically her whole length ashore, but was not badly damaged. A woman was killed, one boy lost a leg and another had two broken when the boat plunged into the crowd.
