## SPENDING THE WATERWORKS MONEY

The question of who should have the spending of the \$550,000 and the manner in which it should be spent, were the great issues in the recent vote on the waterworks bylaw. There was no objection worth noticing to the scheme itself.

A great deal of the objection was on the ground that the money, if voted, would be given to Alderman Hilditch to spend. For some reason or another a large number of citizens, did not wish Alderman Hilditch to have the spending of the money.

The Mayor clearly recognized these objections. On one occasion he made a public recognition of them. He pointed out that the money would be spent by the water and light committee, of which Alderman Hilditch was not a member, and promised that Alderman Hilditch would not be given the spending of the money.

On those representations the money was voted. Since then Alderman Hilditch and his friends have objected to the waterworks expenditures being passed upon in open council. They forced through a motion, appointing a committee with power to act in secret. This motion went through without opposition from Mr. Manson.

The final act of Mr. Manson in the betrayal of the citizens was when he broke his word, and with the whole council to select from, deliberately appointed Alderman Hilditch to become chairman of the light and water committee—the committee that will have the spending of the people's \$550,000.

It is no secret that Alderman Hilditch has ambitions to become the next mayor of Prince Rupert. Mayor Manson's action in handing over to him the control of the waterworks appropriation, is in effect the handing over of a means to secure the return of Alderman Hilditch as Mayor.

There should be no objection to any man who feels like doing so, offering himself as Mayor, and making the best of his candidature. But for Mayor Manson to appoint Alderman Hilditch to the spending of the waterworks money is unfair to the several other aldermen who may have designs on the Mayor's chair.

More than that, it is a distinct breach of faith with the public, who were led to believe that Alderman Hilditch was not to have the spending of the waterworks money.

## WANTED—SOME HISTORIC DOCUMENTS

So far no capable history of British Columbia has been written. Among the other duties of the Provincial Archivist at Victoria, a collection is being made of historical data. This will some day form the Tom Tiddlers ground of the future historian of British Columbia.

Hon. Dr. Young has recently sent out an appeal on behalf of Mr. Schofield, the archivist, inviting all persons in the province who have any historic documents to submit them, either as gifts or for purchase to the archivist's office. Material relating to the colonial and fur trading periods are especially desired, and all other matter relating to the province, such as diaries, letters, manuscripts, etc., and in addition all Indian lore, legends, myths and tribal history.

## NEW TENDERS FOR WOODWORTH

Bids to be in Not Later Than Six p.m. Thursday. Conditions Made Easier. Time Limit Extended. Snow fall Allowed for.

Besides altering the specifications for the work of clearing around the shores of Woodworth Lake, the city council have arranged for an extension of the time limit for the work, and easier conditions in the event of delay occasioned through snowfall. The time limit now set for the completion of the work is "sixty days after the completion of the trail now being built to Woodworth Lake." Another important condition is that the work cannot be accepted while snow remains on the ground. There will be reasonable extensions of time granted to contractors or station gangs for delay occasioned by snow.

It is estimated that the trail to Woodworth cannot be completed within three weeks, and according to Alderman Douglas last night information has reached the city that snow has already been found fresh fallen within 1000 feet of Woodworth Lake. Colonel Davis asked the alderman whether he meant a thousand feet perpendicularly or horizontally? Alderman Douglas was not clear on that point. The council favored the city's constructing the stave pipe last night, the opinion being that there will be plenty of time to find yellow cedar enough before the pipe is needed. Tenders for the clearing of Woodworth Lake shores have been returned to the bidders unopened. New tenders are called for Thursday, 26 inst., at not later than 6 p.m. The council will meet at 8 p.m. to open and consider the bids.

## RAILROADING BYLAWS

Electric Light Plant, and Phone Plant Debenture Bylaws Pushed.

Two money bylaws were railroaded through on Monday night by the city council the rules being suspended in order that they might be read the first and second times and then considered in committee of the whole. Their third reading and final adoption follows at next meeting of council. The bylaws were those to raise the necessary sum by the issue of debentures for the extension of the electric light plant, and to raise \$40,000 by the same method for the telephone plant. Both were fathered by Alderman Kirkpatrick, chairman of the finance committee.
