It is commonly reported that the Imperial family has prepared for flight and will make for Jehol about 115 miles north of Pekin. The road to Jehol is practically lined with troops. Others think that the linking of the Jehol road is only a ruse and the Imperial family will seek refuge in the foreign settlements at Tientsin or some of the other ports.

# CHINESE GENERAL REFUSES TO FIGHT

General Yin Tchang of the Imperial Troops, Insists on Having More Guns and Wages for His Troops Before He Will Advance—Federal Assembly is Deserted-Foreign Residents in the Coast Cities Clamor

for Protection from European Warships

(Canadian Press Despatch)

Pekin, Oct. 25.—There is no longer any doubt as to the success of the Chinese rebels The city of Sian which has been looked on as one of the strongholds of the Government has gone over to them without striking a blow. The whole of the southwest corner of the Chinese Empire is rapidly becoming inflamed, and the people are siding with the rebels.

GENERAL WON'T BUDGE

General Yin Tchang who is in command of the main body of the Imperial troops at Sin Yang Chow has declined to move upon the rebels there. He says they have four hundred guns with them, and he refuse to advance unless supplied with additional guns, and money wherewith to pay the Imperial troops their back pay.

NATIVE BANKERS REFUSE LOANS

The native bankers are alarmed at the success of the rebellion and refuse to lend any money to the Government. Their action is very significant of Chinese opinion on the rebellion.

MEMBERS ARE ABSENT

Even the members of the Federal Assembly which was to open its business sessions in Pekin yesterday, show their indifference to the Government. In the face of the crisis, only ninety of the two hundred members attending the opening of the House yesterday. There was not a single representative from the provinces of Hupeh and Sze Chuen.

## FOREIGNERS ARE ANXIOUS

The foreigners are becoming anxious at the state of affairs. At Sian and Hukow which has also fallen, British and foreign warships are protecting their own country people. At Foo Chow there are a large number of Americans, and they have asked that the warships arrange to protect them in case of an uprising there, as it is certain that the revolution is rapidly travelling eastwards.
