LIFE SENTENCE AT 74

Farquhar McRae Who Shot
Shaw Owing to Ne Temere
Decree Goes to Gaol for Life.

Cornwall, Oct. 31.—In the case of the man McRae charged with the murder of George Shaw the jury have returned a verdict of manslaughter. The shooting followed a dispute over an attempt by Dr. Magee to secure the return of his wife who was the niece of McRae and who separated from her husband as the result of the Ne Temere decree.

Cornwall, Oct. 31.—(Later)—Farquhar McRae, 74 years old, who shot a drug clerk named Shaw as a result of the issuance of the Ne Temere decree, was sentenced to life imprisonment for manslaughter.

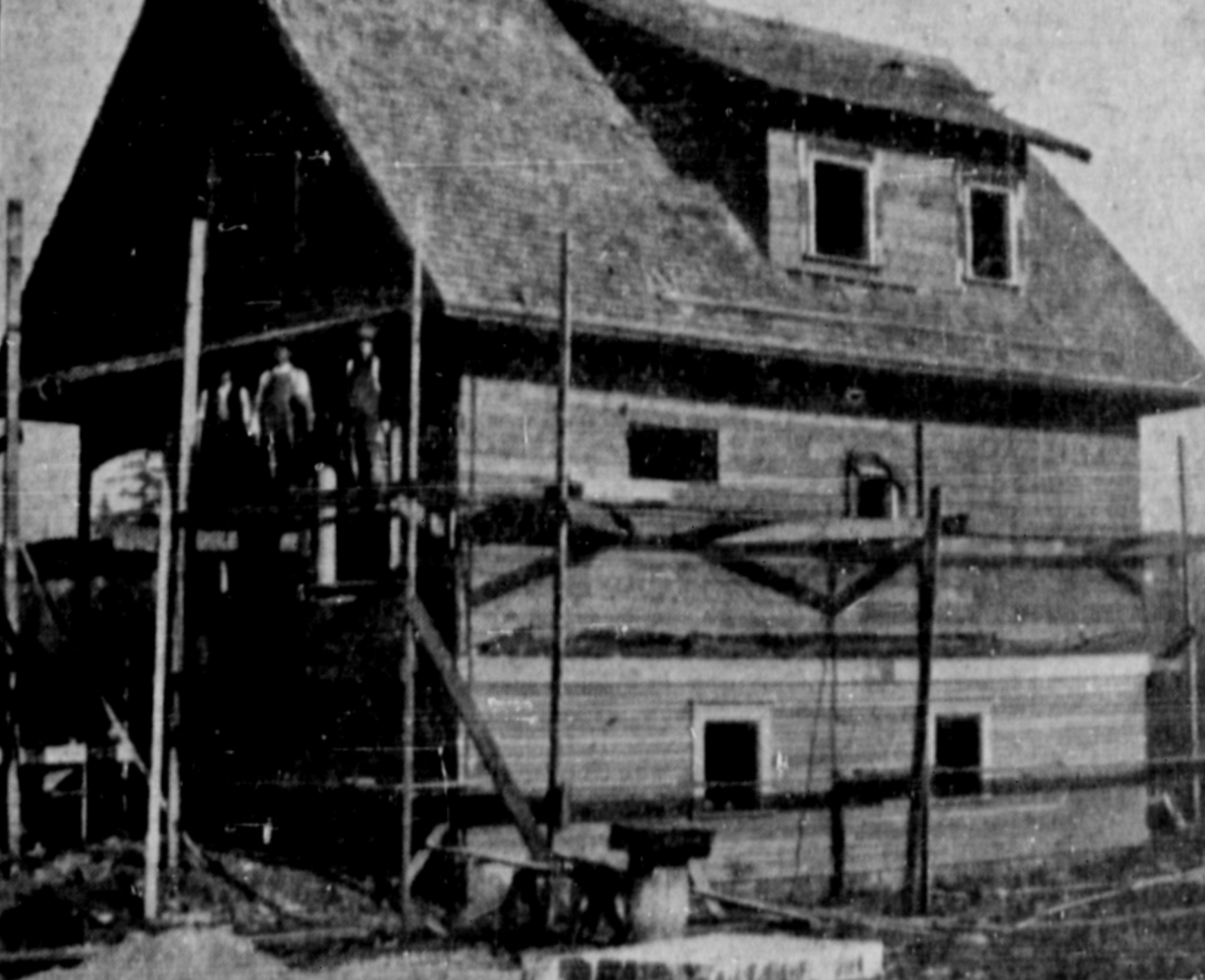
