

HAVE NEW IDEA FOR BORROWERS

A new idea for the loaning of money at a five per cent rate to those who wish to borrow for building homes is being utilized by the Canadian Home Investment Co., Ltd., who have recently opened offices in the McIntyre Block with Mr. A. J. Tate as local manager.

The plan is to arrange for a series of contract holders who each make monthly payments to a pool arranged by the company. Three per cent interest is paid on the money taken in. When the amount is large enough to loan out, the pool goes to the contract holders in turn, who are credited with what they have paid in, and then pay off the balance of their loan at five per cent. The company are meeting with considerable success, and are opening branch offices all over Canada.

MARRIED AN ORIENTAL

California Girl Finds Him a Tyrant and Regrets It

The Princess Hassan, better known as Viola Humphrey, a California girl, is in London seeking divorce from Prince Ibrahim Hassan, first cousin of the Khedive of Egypt, whom she married last April. "He ordered me about," she said, "and I had no freedom of thought or action. I was not allowed to see my friends or even to receive letters. For one month I was a prisoner. I married him for love, but it was a great mistake. He's an Egyptian prince, and I am just one of the plain people, there you have the whole story. In one occasion the prince told me to wait for him in the foyer of the hotel. I waited three hours and a half and then went up to my room. Later the prince came up, very angry. He asked me why I had not waited for him, and said I must obey orders. 'You are the only person in the world,' he said, 'who has ever dared to combat my will.' The prince, now in Paris, won't talk.

"MRS. JEKYLL-HYDE"

Beloved Sunday School Teacher Proves to be Well Known Shop-lifter.

Boston, Nov. 1.—Stories of the Jekyll and Hyde existence of Mrs. Mary L. Burbank, 52 years old, a wealthy Worcester widow, were told following her plea of guilty in the municipal court to charges of stealing goods valued at \$119 from Boston department stores.

When she was taken into custody she strenuously insisted that a mistake had been made, but in court, in the presence of Rev. Mr. Ewing, pastor of a Universalist church at Worcester, in which she is a leader in the Sunday school and teacher of a class of twenty-five girls, she broke down and confessed.

Mr. Ewing, who had come to court to testify that she was a woman of the highest character, was astonished when he heard her plea, and police records were produced showing that she had been arrested in Boston before for shoplifting and fined \$100.

"It can't be," said the minister. "She is one of the most beloved teachers in my Sunday School."
