### RIOTS IN QUEBEC

The mode of nomination of candidates shall be as follows: The candidates shall be nominated in writing, the writing shall be subscribed by two voters of the Municipality as proposer and seconders, and shall be delivered to the Returning Officer at any time between the date of this notice and 2 p. m. of the day of nomination, and in the event of a poll being necessary, such poll will be open on the 14th day of January, 1911, at the City Police Court, Third Avenue, between the hours of 9 a. m. and 7 p. m., of which every person is hereby required to take notice and govern themselves accordingly.

Persons qualified to be nominated for and elected as aldermen shall be male British subjects, of the full age of 21 years, and are not disqualified under any law, and have been for six months next preceding the day of nomination, the registered owner in the Land Registry Office of land or real property, or who is the holder of an equity or interest in real property in the City of Prince Rupert of the assessed value of \$1,000.00 or more, and whose name appears upon the last Municipal Assessment Roll as such owner.
