Many are the old superstitions peculiar to the New Year, and some are practiced even in this matter-of-fact twentieth century in country places far from the hoot of the motor horn or the whistle of the approaching train.

The most curious superstition is, perhaps, that relating to the future husband of any girl who is anxious to know her fate and cares to "put it to the touch." She must eat a hard boiled egg the yolk of which has been replaced with salt, and then go to bed without quenching the inevitable thirst she will suffer from. She will dream of someone who will bring her a glass of water, and the someone will be her future husband.

RAG EAG FROCKS

They Are Being Made from "a Little of Everything" This Year.

You simply cannot be out of style. It does not make any difference what you wear you are fashionably dressed.

Every sort of fabric is correct this year. It is a great chance for made-over clothes, because all the odds and ends can be put together. Chiffon, silk, velvet, ribbon, fringe, braid, buttons, lace, embroidery, indeed the more things one uses in the construction of a frock the handsomer it is.

A very handsome gown is made with the under petticoat of apricot pink. This is long, having a train about three inches. The tunic is wrapped about, lapping at the left side. The tunic proper is edged with black velvet, the fold patterned macramé lapping the velvet and narrow bits of the lace being used on the over seam.

In the bodice the lace is used next to the silk and partially veiled with the black chiffon. A black belt edged with the pink silk is at the waist and the same trimming is used on the sleeves.

Soft smoke colored gray is becoming if you are a blonde. An exquisite dress in this color was recently made. It was intended for simple dinners. The foundation was gray taffeta silk, with the over skirt being of chiffon in the same tone. This was heavily embroidered in the exact shade of the chiffon. The yoke of the blouse was of point de sprite and a plastron of the embroidery outlined the yoke. The edge of the tunic was trimmed with gray satin and the same fabric was used as a belt.

Two Tea Table Treats.

A Delicious Hot Cake—Mix one pound of flour, one ounce of castor sugar and a pinch of salt in a basin. Rub three ounces of butter into it. Beat up one egg in half a pint of milk and mix ingredients into a light dough. Roll out half an inch thick. Cut into rounds three inches in diameter, brush over with egg and

bake in a quick oven for fifteen minutes.

Wheaten Scones—Six ounces of wheaten meal, two ounces of flour, a small piece of butter, a teaspoonful of cream of tartar, half a teaspoonful of baking soda, half a teaspoonful of salt, a teaspoonful of sugar and a little milk. Method: Rub the butter into the dry ingredients, mix to a stiff dough with the milk. Cut into rounds, brush over with egg or milk and bake in a quick oven for ten minutes.

YAKOUN RIVER COAL
