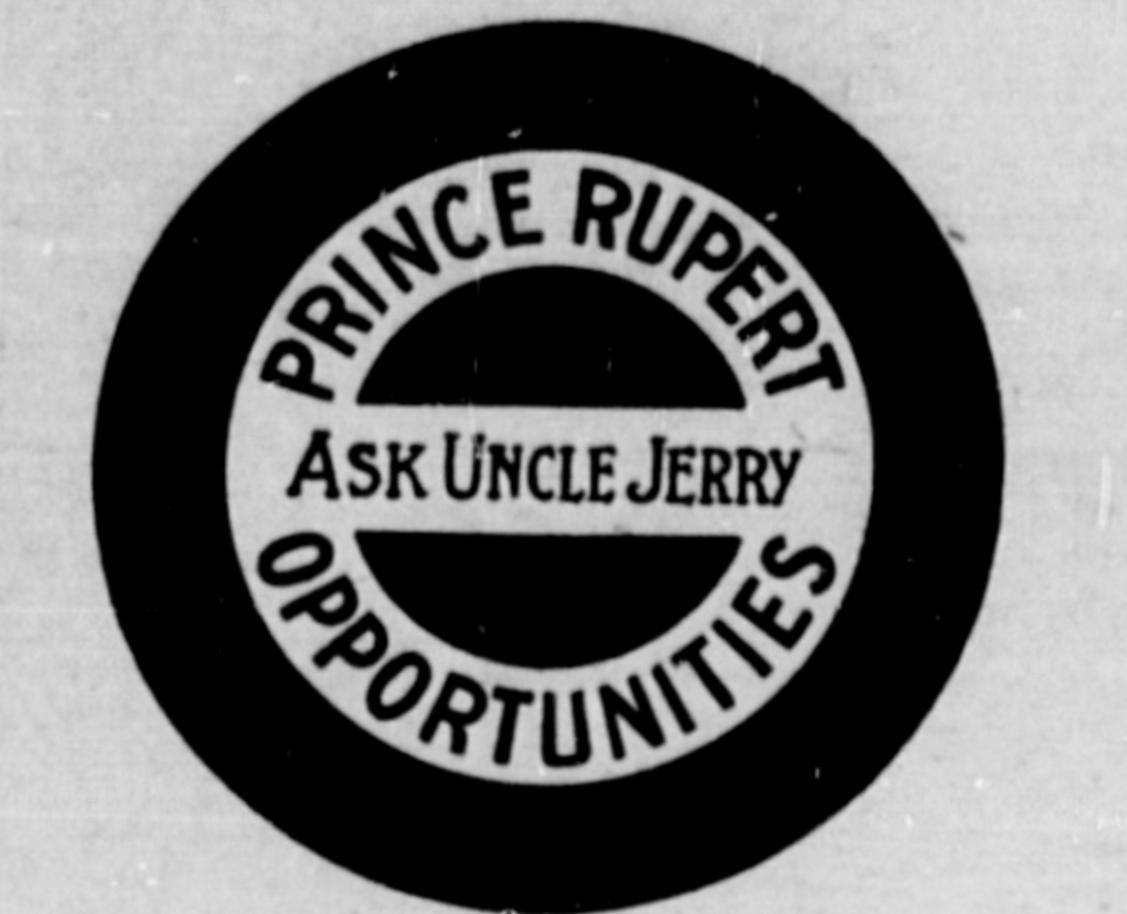

MUNICIPAL ELECTION

NOMINATION NOTICE.

Public notice is hereby given to the electors of the Municipality of Prince Rupert that I require the presence of the said electors at the City Hall on Monday, the 8th day of January, 1912, at 12 o'clock noon, for the purpose of electing persons to represent them in the Municipal Council as Mayor and Aldermen.

The mode of nomination of candidates shall be as follows:
The candidates shall be nominated in writing. The writing shall be subscribed by two voters of the Municipality as proposers and seconders, and shall be delivered to the Returning Officer at any time between the date of this notice and 2 p. m. of the day of nomination, and in the event of a poll being necessary, such poll will be open on the 11th day of January, 1912, at the City Police Court, Third Avenue, between the hours of 9 a. m. and 7 p. m., of which every person is hereby required to take notice and govern themselves accordingly.

Qualifications for Mayor.

Persons qualified to be nominated for and elected as Mayor of the City of Prince Rupert shall be male British subjects of the full age of 21 years, and are not disqualified under any law, and have been for the six months next preceding the day of nomination, the registered owner in the Land Registry Office of land or real property, or who is the holder of an equity or equities in real property in the City of Prince Rupert of the assessed value of \$1,000.00 or more, and whose name appears upon the last Municipal Assessment Roll as such owner.

Qualifications for Aldermen.

Persons qualified to be nominated for and elected as aldermen shall be male British subjects, of the full age of 21 years, and are not disqualified under any law, and have been for the six months next preceding the day of nomination, the registered owner in the Land Registry Office of land or real property, or the holders of an equity or equities in real property in the City of Prince Rupert of the assessed value of \$500.00 or more, and whose name appears on the last Municipal Assessment Roll as such owner.

MONEY BYLAWS IN THE COUNCIL

Section One Grading Debentures Amounting to \$600,000 and the Issuance of Inscribed Stock.

Two important bylaws came before the City Council last night. One was to authorize the issuance of debentures for Section 1 street grading to the amount of \$600,000. This was introduced, passed its successive stages and will come up for reconsideration tonight. The other bylaw was to authorize the issuance of inscribed stock as provided by the 1911 statutes. This also passed first, second and third readings and comes up for reconsideration tonight.

City Is Healthy.

Prince Rupert is in a good state of health at present, with a birth rate of 19.2 per thousand and a death rate of only 4.8 per thousand. There were eight birth last month and two deaths, one of which was due to accident. This is the report of the Medical Health Officer at Council last night.
