ALASKAN RAILROAD LICENSE LAW REPEALED

Washington, July 11.—The Alaskan railroad license law, under which penalties much of the mileage of the territory has been shut down, was repealed by the Senate and an income tax of one per cent on gross earnings in addition to the normal income tax was enacted.

The bill has passed the House and awaits the president's signature. Penalties, running into hundreds of thousands of dollars under the old law were wiped out.
