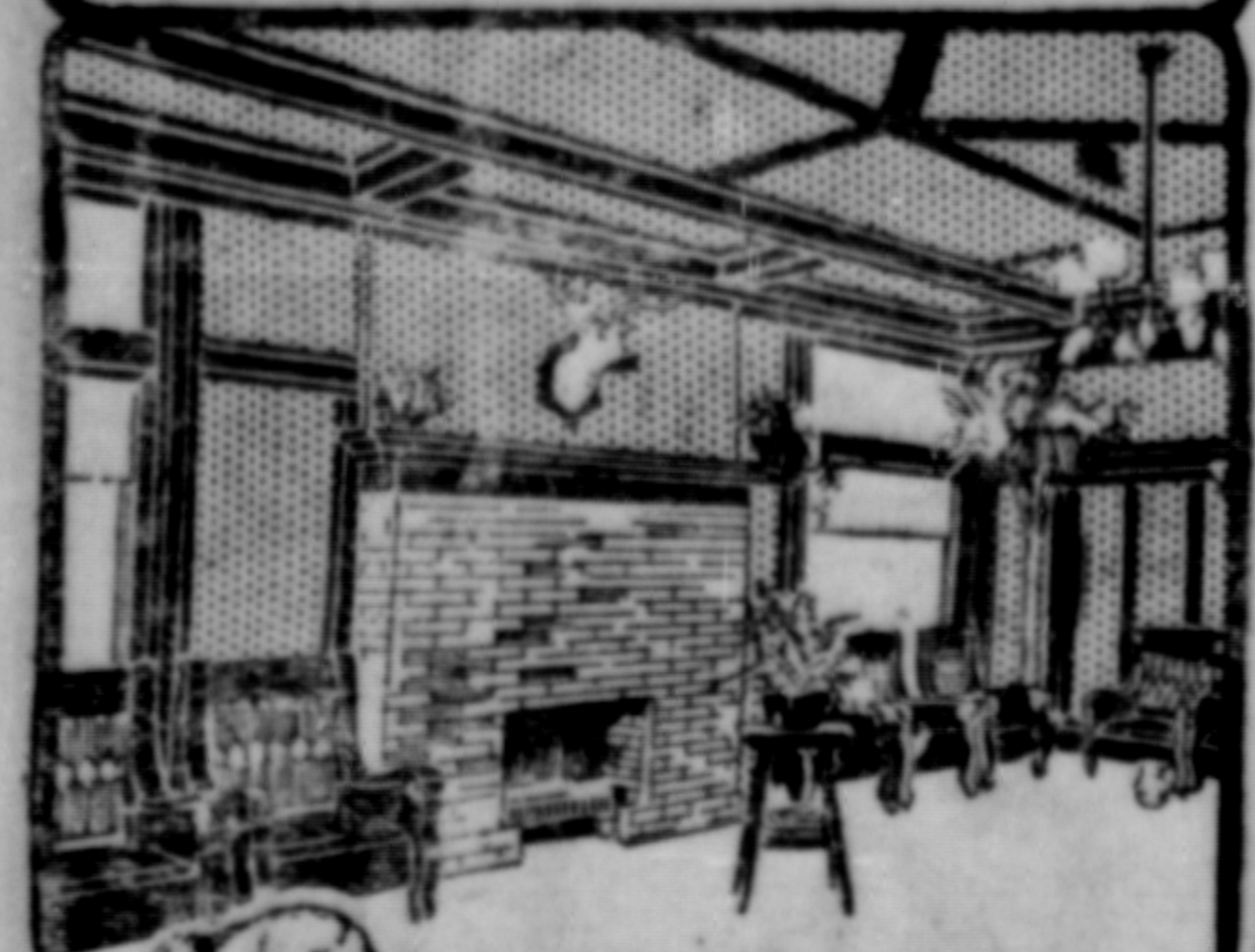

LOCAL MEMBER DISCUSSES THE PEACE TREATY

(Continued from Page Three)

expansion. It means that the
freedom and independence of the
people of Belgium have been re-
stored and guaranteed. It means
that great France, lying for half
a century in hourly dread of the
iron heel of ruthless invasion, is
now free to develop her great
national wealth and power and to
pursue the destiny which is hers
in the arts and sciences by nature
of her country and the temper of
her people. It means that the lost
provinces of Italy have been re-
stored and it means that the Bal-
kan nations will be a great inde-
pendent influence in European
affairs. It means that the century
old struggle of the Serbians, Croa-
tians and Slovaks and Hungarians
for nationhood has reached its
goal.

Right and Justice.

It means that Poland is now
restored as a nation, proving that
there is a spirit of right and jus-
tice in this world that will over-
turn the designs of potentates,
no matter how careful, who will
interfere with the holy cause of a
devoted people.

"It means that ancient Greece
is re-established in a greatness
far beyond the dreams of those
poets and philosophers who have
left an influence on the classic
world that is not dead and will
never die. It means that cruel
Germany, the most cruel, design-
ing and ambitious power that ever
threatened the liberty of the
world, is humbled to her knees
and will never again be able to
threaten the foundations of the
world. It means that the power
of Germany, who arrogantly
threatened the liberties of the
world and of every man sitting
here is unquestionably broken,
and I can not sympathize with the
honorable gentleman who has
such wonderful sympathy for
Germany.

"If he had suffered as we did,
God knows if he had suffered un-
der that tremendous fire of ar-
tillery and had endured the treat-
ment which was meted to our
prisoners, he would not have that
wonderful sympathy. What does
this treaty signify? It means that
the arrogant and malicious house
of Hapsburg which has for ages
plotted against the peace of Eu-
rope and the liberties of its own
people, is swept from its throne.

"It means that the shallow am-
bitions of Bulgaria have been
curbed for good and all. It means
that malignant power, which has
for so many ages disgraced civil-
ization is now banished from Eu-
rope. It means that Mr. Glad-
stone is vindicated and the throne
of Solomon is still in the desert
sands of Arabia.

Happiness and Prosperity.

"It means that if we prosecute
the designs of those men whose
serene and benevolent wisdom
caused this, the world will be
filled with happiness and pros-
perity. It means that the great
powerful and liberty-loving na-
tions of the world are going to
throw out the life line to the
weak and perishing, those people
who are now sunk in misery and
ignorance and degradation. It
means that the vision is to be
realized of Him, who nearly two
thousand years ago, on Calvary,
endured for mankind and sent
forth his last message of pity
and love.

"It means that that tremendous
humanity, those millions of men
in Asia and Africa and other parts
of the world, will enjoy that civil
and religious freedom which you
and I and all of us enjoy. We
who are sent here by the esteem
and affection of our fellow-
countrymen are going to put our
shoulders together and burst
open the doors of arbitrary power
and let in the great flood of God's
sunlight that will warm and re-
vive the great struggling masses.

"It means that the rough places
of the earth are going to be made
smooth; that instead of briar
shall come up myrtle tree; the
land will resound to the sounds
of peace and gladness, the people
will come to their Zion with joy
everlasting, and sorrow and sigh-
ing shall flee away."

The valiant colonel was greeted
with a regular tornado of ap-
plause in which the opposition
joined as he resumed his seat.
