President Sun Yat Sen of New Chinese Republic Declares That the Centre of China Will Be Changed.

(Canadian Press Despatch.) Shanghai, Feb. 20 .- The draft

of the proposed Magna Charta of the new Chinese republic has been completed by Dr. Wu Ting Fang, the minister of justice in the republican cabinet, and now awaits the approval of the Senate at Nanking.

The document provides for presidential term of five years, but the Senate will probably mak the first term only one year.

It is thought that a compromise may be reached on the question of the future capital of China. President Sun Yat Sen, however, asserts positively that Nanking will be selected, although he admits at the same time that an agreement may be made to keep Pekin provisionally as the nom-
