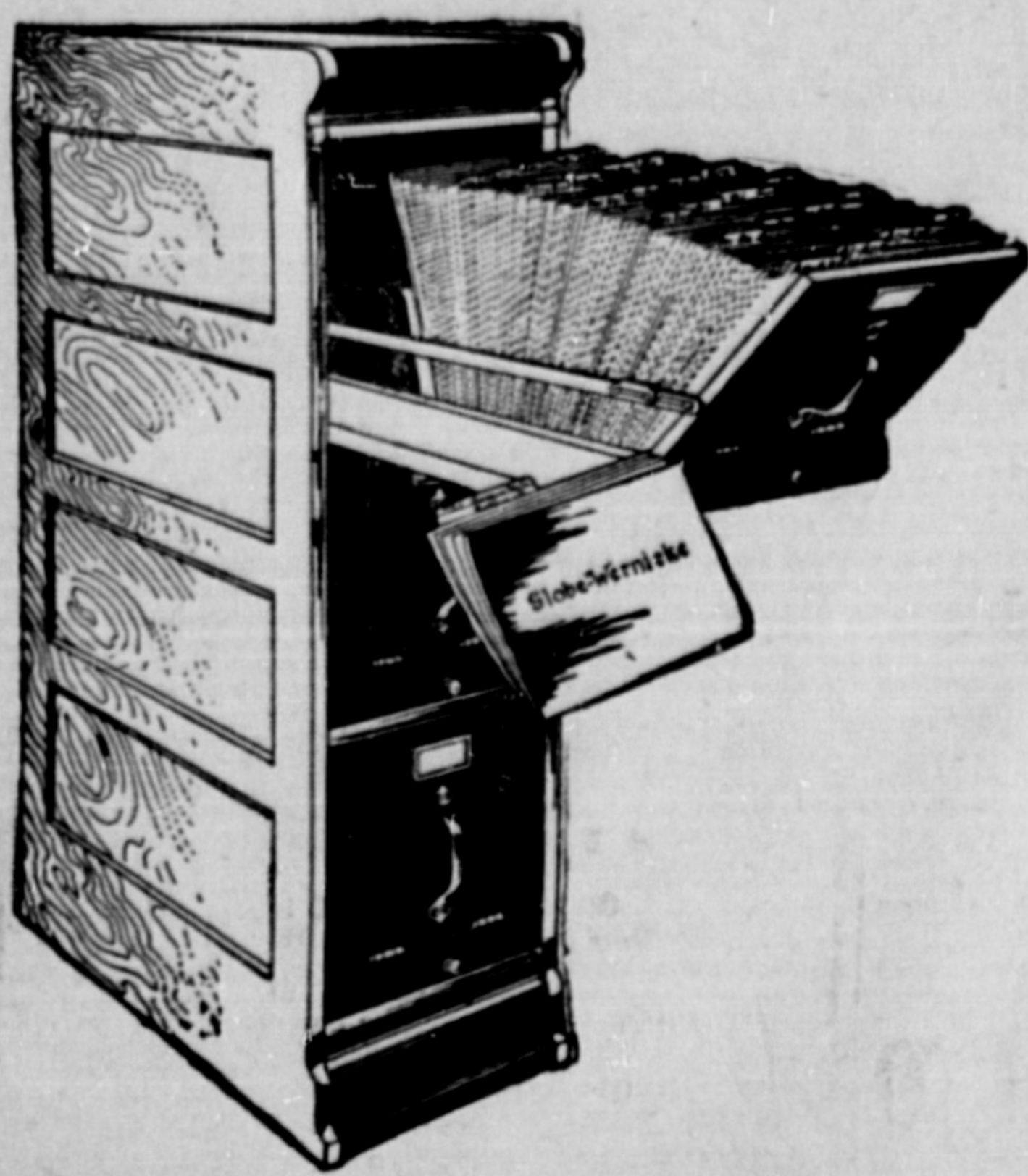
PERSONALS.

Extract from Bylaw No. 10, Clause 4:

"The erection or alteration of any

building shall not be commenced in the

City of Prince Rupert until a permit for

such erection or alteration shall first be

obtained from the Inspector by the owner

or his agent, and no such owner or agent

shall proceed with such erection or altera-

tion until said permit has been obtained."

Penalty.

Extract from Clause 169:

"Any person found guilty of an infrac-

tion of the bylaw shall be liable to a fine

not exceeding \$100.00"

Boreman was taking a shell out of a shotgun when the lurch of the boat caused the weapon to be discharged and the shot carried off the upper part of his foot.
