

Shanghai, March 19 .- Children are selling in the Central China famine district today for a trifle less than \$1 American money each. Not in years have such bargains been offered. Speculators are investing heavily in promising girls. Boys are not so much in demand.

The fathers and mothers who! are selling their own children to strangers say that they have no choice between selling them and seeing them starve to death. Already the people of the famine districts are dying by wholesale either of directly starvation or of the diseases which attend it.
