**OUR NEIGHBOR Prince Rupert**° and **Prince George** Final Work on Alaska Boundary Line Being Undertaken This Summer by Party Now Going North. Vancouver, May 4.-The final stages of the determination and location of the international boundary line between Canada and Alaska along the 141st meridian as far north as the Arctic Ocean will be completed this season by a Dominion government survey party in charge of J. D. Craig, a veteran surveyor who is here outfitting for the expedition. Mr. Craig will be accompanied by forty or fifty persons, to be distributed into four sub-parties, to be occupied in various phases SAMUEL HARRISON (NOTARY PUBLIC) of the work.
