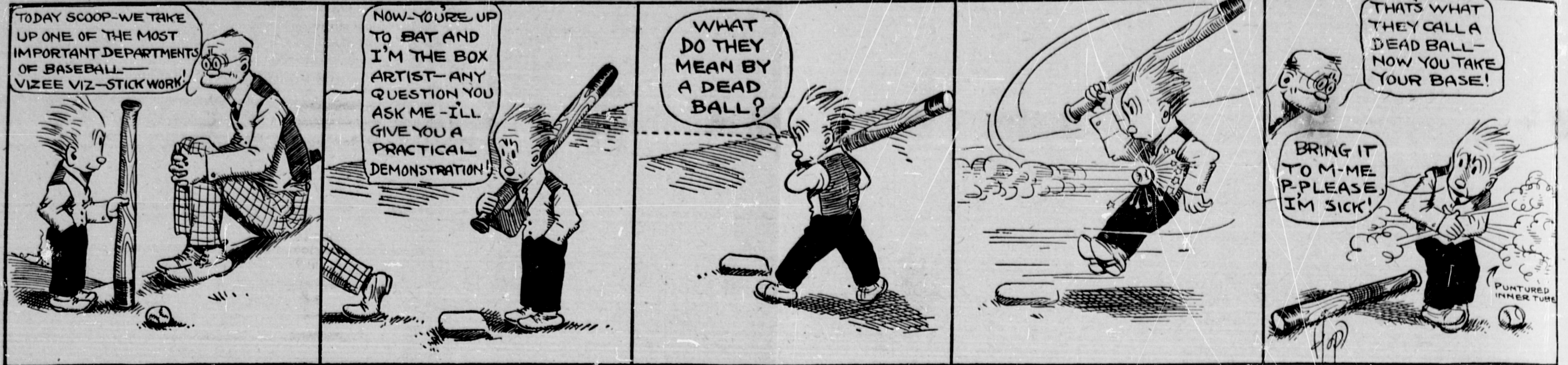

### ANGLICAN CHURCH SYNOD STANDS FIRM FOR OLD NAME

"CHURCH OF ENGLAND IN CANADA" NOT FITTING—SHOUTS AND CHEERS GREET ADDRESS OF HON. W. H. HOYLE ON THE SUBJECT—PROPOSAL VOTED DOWN.

Deafening applause broken into shouts and cheers at the meeting of the Anglican Synod when the Hon. W. H. Hoyle, speaker of the local Legislature, reached the climax of an impassioned speech in which he declared for the retention without change of the name "Anglican Church in Canada," as indicative of the relations of the Anglican body in the Dominion to the mother church in the old land.

"The Church of England is the British church from its Catholic days downward," declared Hon. Mr. Hoyle amid cheers. "It is said a rose by any other name would smell as sweet, but it wouldn't be a rose. At our time of life, imbued with sentiments we can't get away from, we resist such a change. You young Canadians, give us a chance to get out of the way before you make your sweeping changes."

The discussion arose over the motion by Mr. James Edmund Jones:

(1) That in the opinion of this synod the title "The Church of England in Canada" is not a correct description of the church and is not the best name that can be devised.

(2) That a vote be taken upon which each member of the synod may indicate the name that he prefers should be adopted.

(3) That no further action be taken at this session and that the matter be left over for further consideration at a subsequent session.

Mr. Jones spoke to his motion, as did Archdeacon Ingles, in a quiet vein, before Mr. Hoyle took the floor to hew down the proposal. Mr. Hoyle declared that he had heard of no agitation for a change of name outside the Toronto Synod.

"What name do you want to give the church?" asked Mr. Hoyle, addressing a delegate. "What name would you give it?" he asked another. "And you?"

The questioning aroused general laughter, and Mr. Hoyle cried: "See, no one will even stand godfather to this new name—yet to be born."

Mr. Hoyle moved in amendment that the resolution be laid on the table, seconded by the Rev. E. W. Pickford. The bishop called for the "ayes" and "nays," and though the "nays" made a louder cry than the "ayes," he declared the amendment carried.
