The theory that the Germans, responsible for two world wars, are making detailed plans for their third attempt at world conquest is the theme of "The Master Race," coming to the Capitol Theatre Wednesday.

Reviewing the number and quality of libraries across the Dominion, the Youth Commisdian Central Jute Committee at sion reports that a levy of 50 cents per capita is reckoned as the minimum on which an adequate library service can be maintained. In Canada in 1942, less than 20 cents per capita was spent on libraries, compared with 30 cents in Britain and 40 cents in the United States.

The commission quotas the Dominion Bureau of Statistics as i reporting that more than 50 per cent of the population of Can-! ada is without library service, compared with 25 per cent in the U.S. and one per cent in Britain.


