

## Australia Turns Out Labor Government Victoria Fur City Manager

George Re-Elected Mayor After Close Contest

VICTORIA (P) - Mayor Percy George was re-elected in the civic elections here Thursday, defeating Ald. M. Aubrey Kent in the closest mayoral election since Victoria was incorporated in 1862. The vote was:

George. 4,846 Kent. 4,615

Mr. George has been mayor since 1944.

The voters, by plebiscite, also chose the city manager form of government by a margin of four one, the vote being 6744 for and 1,691 against.

# Drill 500

Royalite Losing No Time On Graham Island

Drilling for oil on the Queen Charlottes has begun. Robert E. Stanhope, chief tool push with the Royalite Oil Co. at Skidegate, announced yesterday a depth of over 500 feet has been reached with the outfit that was recently

Geologists have not determined the name of rock formation that has been reached, but it is of a hard sandy shale nature.

The drill was spudded in November 30 shortly after the third and final load of equipment was delivered from the beach head. A 1034 inch casing is being used which required 145 bags of 1412. cement to construct.

Location of the drill is just 103.09 north of Skidegate Mission on Graham Island.

SYDNEY (CP)—Australia has ended eight years of Labor government by voting into power a two-party anti-Socialist coalition led by Robert Menzies. The Liberal-Country Party coalition, led by Menzies, former Prime Minister, which made the election a straight fight against Prime Minister J. B. Chifley's Socialist policies, today had won or

Menzies, aged 54, who was Prime Minister from 1939 to 1941, was successful in his own riding of Kooyong, Victoria. He made his campaign a straight attack on the government's socialization policies.

Chifley, 64, veteran trade union leader, went to the country on his government's record. He himself was re-elected to his old McQuarrie seat in Parliament.
