Block of National Film Board Here Being Increased In View of Popularity of Service

Service of the National Film Board in Prince Rupert is proving so popular that A. M. Wilson, field representative of the Board with headquarters in Prince George, has decided to recomthat the block of films made available here monthly be increased from ten to forty. Mr. Wilson is leaving Monday on his return to Prince George after spending the past few days here on official busi-

Distribution of films here is handled by the local Film Council of which Sgt. L. A. N. Potterton, provincial police, is president and the public library is the distribution centre. Here the films are available for the use of some sixty local organizations which are members of the Film Council. The stock of films is completely changed every three months.

The picture season is on again and there is every indication that coming months will exceed the previous high month, May of this year, when there were thirty showings of film to a Drew, newly elected leader of the Progressive Conservative party, total of 1500 persons.

A new development here is the co-operation of the Indian Department in the distribution of film to such places as Port Simpson, Stewart, Alice Arm, Butedale, Port Edward and Miller Bay. For these outlying coastal points a projector has been made available.
